SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 605/605-8 new

Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. Creates the Economic Development Advisory Board within the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to make recommendations to the Department on economic development matters. Sets forth procedures by which members are appointed to the Board. Sets forth procedures for the operation of the Board. Sets forth the duties of the Board. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY HB6840

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AN ACT concerning economic development.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic
Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
amended by adding Section 605-8 as follows:

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(20 ILCS 605/605-8 new)

Sec. 605-8. Economic Development Advisory Board.

9 (a) The Economic Development Advisory Board is created
 10 within the Department.

(b) The Advisory Board shall consist of 10 voting members 11 as follows: 2 members appointed by the Governor, one of whom 12 shall be designated as the chairperson of the Advisory Board at 13 14 the time of appointment; 2 members appointed by the President 15 of the Senate; 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of 16 17 Representatives; and 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. The Director or his or her 18 19 designee shall serve, ex officio, as a nonvoting member.

Of the members appointed by each legislative leader, one 20 21 must be a member of the General Assembly and one must (i) have meaningful experience in matters concerning economic 22 development; (ii) have knowledge about the economic 23 development needs of the State and its regions; and (iii) have 24 the ability to contribute to the evaluation of current State 25 26 economic development efforts and to the planning of future endeavors and programs to develop the State's economy. 27

Each appointed member shall serve at the pleasure of the person, or his or her successor, who appointed the member. If a vacancy occurs in the Advisory Board membership, the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment. All members must be appointed to the Advisory Board on or HB6840
