### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/2-3.135 new

Amends the School Code. Requires the State Board of Education, in cooperation with the Department of Transportation and the Department of State Police, to establish and administer a Safe Routes to School Construction Program for the construction of bicycle and pedestrian safety and traffic-calming projects using federal transportation funds, with construction grants being made available to local governmental agencies. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
2-3.135 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/2-3.135 new)

Sec. 2-3.135. Safe Routes to School Construction Program.
(a) The State Board of Education, in cooperation with the
Department of Transportation and the Department of State
Police, shall establish and administer a Safe Routes to School
Construction Program for the construction of bicycle and
pedestrian safety and traffic-calming projects using federal
transportation funds.

14 (b) The State Board of Education shall make construction 15 grants available to local governmental agencies under the Safe 16 Routes to School Construction Program based on the results of a 17 statewide competition that requires submission of Safe Routes 18 to School proposals for funding and that rates those proposals 19 on all of the following factors:

(1) Demonstrated needs of the grant applicant.

21 <u>(2) Potential of the proposal for reducing child</u> 22 <u>injuries and fatalities.</u>

23 (3) Potential of the proposal for encouraging
 24 <u>increased walking and bicycling among students.</u>

(4) Identification of safety hazards.

26 (5) Identification of current and potential walking
 27 and bicycling routes to school.

28 (6) Consultation and support for projects by
 29 school-based associations, local traffic engineers, local
 30 elected officials, law enforcement agencies, and school
 31 officials.

32 With respect to the use of federal transportation funds,

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prior to the award of a construction grant or the use of those funds for a Safe Routes to School project encompassing a freeway, State highway, or county road, the State Board of Education shall consult with and obtain approval from the Department of State Police ensuring that the Safe Routes to School proposal is consistent with a statewide pedestrian safety statistical analysis.

8 <u>(c) On March 30, 2005 and each March 30th thereafter, the</u> 9 <u>State Board of Education shall submit a report to the General</u> 10 <u>Assembly listing and describing the projects funded under the</u> 11 <u>Safe Routes to School Construction Program.</u>

(d) The State Board of Education shall study the 12 effectiveness of the Safe Routes to School Construction 13 Program, with particular emphasis on the Program's 14 effectiveness in reducing traffic accidents and its 15 16 contribution to improving safety and reducing the number of 17 child injuries and fatalities in the vicinity of a Safe Routes to School project. The State Board of Education shall submit a 18 report to the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2005 19 20 regarding the results of the study.

(e) The State Board of Education, Department of
 Transportation, and Department of State Police may adopt any
 rules necessary to implement this Section.

24 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 25 becoming law.
