19	Section 10. The amount of \$50,300, or so much thereof as
20	may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller
21	from the State Lottery Fund for expenses in connection with
22	the State Lottery.

24	Section 12. The amount of \$250,000, or so much thereof
25	as may be necessary, is appropriated to the State Comptroller
26	to meet the ordinary and contingent expenses for the Office
27	of Inspector General.
28	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
29	2004.
