- 7 big city problem; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Each year sees an increase in the number of
- 9 deaths among those who lack funds to provide the barest
- 10 essentials of life; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Bitter cold winters and extremely hot summers
- 12 have cost the lives of those individuals who simply could not
- 13 afford heating or air coolants and died from exposure; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In remembering those who have died, we must
- reach out to help those in need; the extent to which our
- 16 society can counter the effects of indigency is a good
- measure of its humaneness; therefore, be it
- 18 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE
- 19 NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE
- 20 SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we proclaim Wednesday May 28,
- 21 2004, as "We Remember, We Care for Indigent Persons Day in
- 22 Illinois", and that we urge all citizens to observe, inform
- 23 themselves of, and support efforts to care for the indigent;

- 25 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be
- 26 presented to W. Earl Lewis, Director of the Memorial Ministry
- of Indigent Persons.
