- 7 Sec. 12-603.1. Driver and passenger required to use
- 8 safety belts, exceptions and penalty.

- 15 (c) Failure to wear a seat safety belt in violation of
- this Section shall not be considered evidence of negligence,
- 17 shall not limit the liability of an insurer, and shall not
- 18 diminish any recovery for damages arising out of the
- ownership, maintenance, or operation of a motor vehicle.
- 20 (d) A violation of this Section shall be a petty offense
- 21 and subject to a fine not to exceed \$25.
