- 1 AN ACT concerning commerce.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Community
- 5 Affairs Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
- 6 amended by adding Section 605-865 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 605/605-865 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 605-865. Family-friendly workplace initiative. The</u>
- 9 <u>Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, with the advice</u>
- 10 of members of the business community, may establish a
- 11 <u>family-friendly workplace initiative</u>. The Department may
- 12 <u>develop</u> a <u>program to annually collect information regarding</u>
- 13 <u>the State's private eligible employers with 50 or fewer</u>
- 14 employees and private eligible employers with 51 or more
- 15 <u>employees in the State providing the most family-friendly</u>
- 16 <u>benefits</u> to their employees. The same program may be
- 17 <u>established for public employers. The criteria for</u>
- 18 <u>determining eligible employers includes, but is not limited</u>
- 19 <u>to, the following:</u>
- 20 (1) consideration of the dependent care scholarship
- 21 <u>or discounts given by the employer;</u>
- 22 (2) flexible work hours and schedules;
- 23 (3) time off for caring for sick or injured
- 24 <u>dependents;</u>
- 25 <u>(4) the provision of onsite or nearby dependent</u>
- 26 <u>care;</u>
- 27 <u>(5) dependent care referral services; and</u>
- 28 <u>(6) in-kind contributions to community dependent</u>
- 29 <u>care programs.</u>
- Those employers chosen by the Department may be
- 31 recognized with annual "family-friendly workplace" awards and

- 1 <u>a Statewide information and advertising campaign publicizing</u>
- the employers' awards, their contributions to family-friendly
- 3 child care, and the methods they used to improve the
- 4 <u>dependent care experiences of their employees' families.</u>
- 5 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 6 becoming law.
