- 1 AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 726
- 2 AMENDMENT NO. ____. Amend Senate Bill 726 by replacing
- 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:
- 4 "Section 5. The Department of Transportation Law of the
- 5 Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding
- 6 Section 2705-207 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2705/2705-207 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 2705-207. Regional Transportation Task Force.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) The Regional Transportation Task Force is created</u>
- 10 <u>within the Department.</u>
- 11 (b) The Task Force shall consist of 11 voting members,
- 12 <u>as follows: 3 members appointed by the Governor, one of whom</u>
- shall be designated as chair of the task force at the time of
- 14 appointment; 2 members appointed by the President of the
- 15 <u>Senate; 2 members appointed by the Senate Minority Leader; 2</u>
- 16 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 17 Representatives; and 2 members appointed by the House
- 18 <u>Minority Leader</u>.
- 19 <u>The following shall serve, ex officio, as non-voting</u>
- 20 <u>members</u>: the <u>Secretary of Transportation</u>; one <u>member</u>
- 21 <u>designated by the Chicago Area Transportation Study (CATS);</u>
- 22 one member designated by the Northeastern Illinois Planning

- 1 <u>Commission (NIPC); one member designated by the Regional</u>
- 2 <u>Transportation Authority (RTA); one member designated by the</u>
- 3 <u>Illinois State Toll Highway Authority (ISTHA); 2 members of</u>
- 4 <u>Congress representing Illinois from different political</u>
- 5 parties, as designated by the Governor; and 4 members
- 6 <u>designated by the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus.</u>
- 7 If a vacancy occurs in the task force membership, the
- 8 <u>vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the initial</u>
- 9 <u>appointment</u>.
- 10 (c) The task force may begin to conduct business upon
- 11 the appointment of a majority of the voting members,
- 12 <u>including the chair.</u>
- 13 (d) The task force may adopt bylaws; it must meet at
- 14 <u>least once each calendar quarter; and it may establish</u>
- 15 <u>committees and officers as it deems necessary.</u> For purposes
- 16 <u>of task force meetings, a quorum is 6 voting members.</u>
- 17 <u>Meetings of the task force are subject to the Open Meetings</u>
- 18 Act. The task force must afford an opportunity for public
- 19 <u>comment at each of its meetings.</u>
- 20 (e) Task force members shall serve without compensation,
- 21 <u>but may be reimbursed for their reasonable travel expenses</u>
- 22 <u>from funds available for that purpose. The Department shall</u>
- 23 provide staff and administrative support services to the task
- 24 <u>force. The Department and the task force may accept donated</u>
- 25 <u>services and other resources from registered not-for-profit</u>
- 26 <u>organizations as may be necessary to complete the work of the</u>
- 27 <u>task force with minimal expense to the State of Illinois.</u>
- 28 <u>(f) The task force shall gather information and make</u>
- 29 <u>recommendations to the Governor and to the General Assembly</u>
- 30 <u>regarding metro area transportation programs in northeastern</u>
- 31 <u>Illinois</u>, which includes, without limitation, the counties of
- 32 <u>Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry, and Will. These</u>
- 33 <u>recommendations must include, without limitation:</u>
- 34 (1) examining the feasibility of merging CATS,

1	NIPC, RTA, and ISTHA into a single agency;
2	(2) identifying areas where functions of these and
3	other agencies are redundant or unnecessary;
4	(3) identifying methods to promote cost
5	effectiveness, efficiency, and equality in meeting area
6	transportation needs; and
7	(4) examining regional and economic impact as it
8	relates to potential policy implementation.
9	(g) The task force shall submit a report to the Governor
10	and the General Assembly by March 1, 2004 concerning its
11	findings and recommendations.
12	(h) This Section is repealed on January 1, 2005.
13	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
14	becoming law.".
