1 AN ACT concerning dogs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Guide Dog Access Act is amended by5 changing Section 1 as follows:

6 (720 ILCS 630/1) (from Ch. 38, par. 65-1)

Sec. 1. When a blind, hearing impaired or physically 7 8 handicapped person or a person who is subject to epilepsy or other seizure disorders is accompanied by a dog which serves 9 10 as a guide, or leader, seizure-alert, or seizure-response dog for such person or when a trainer of a guide, or leader, 11 12 seizure-alert, or seizure-response dog is accompanied by a 13 guide, or leader, seizure-alert, or seizure-response dog or a dog that is being trained to be a guide, or leader, 14 15 seizure-alert, or seizure-response dog, neither the person 16 nor the dog shall be denied the right of entry and use of facilities of any public place of accommodation as defined in 17 18 Section 5-101 of the "Illinois Human Rights Act", if such dog 19 is wearing a harness and such person presents credentials for 20 inspection issued by a school for training guide, leader, seizure-alert, or seizure-response dogs. 21

Any violation of this Act is a Class C misdemeanor.

the same right as the able-bodied to the full and free use of the streets, highways, sidewalks, walkways, public buildings, public facilities and other public places.

4 The blind, the visually handicapped, the hearing 5 impaired, persons who are subject to epilepsy or other seizure disorders, and the otherwise physically disabled are 6 7 entitled to full and equal accommodations, advantages, facilities and privileges of all common carriers, airplanes, 8 9 motor vehicles, railroad trains, motor buses, street cars, boats or any other public conveyances or modes of 10 11 transportation, hotels, lodging places, places of public accommodation, amusement or resort and other places to which 12 the general public is invited, subject only to the conditions 13 and limitations established by law and applicable alike to 14 15 all persons.

16 Every totally or partially blind, hearing impaired, person who is subject to epilepsy or other seizure disorders, 17 or otherwise physically disabled person or a trainer of 18 dogs, guide dogs, <u>seizure-alert dogs,</u> 19 support seizure-response dogs, or hearing dogs shall have the right 20 21 to be accompanied by a support dog or guide dog especially 22 trained for the purpose, or a dog that is being trained to be 23 a support dog, guide dog, <u>seizure-alert dog, seizure-response</u> dog, or hearing dog, in any of the places listed in this 24 25 Section without being required to pay an extra charge for the guide, support, seizure-alert, seizure-response, or hearing 26 dog; provided that he shall be liable for any damage done to 27 the premises or facilities by such dog. 28
