- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and
- 5 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
- 6 amended by changing Section 2310-220 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-220) (was 20 ILCS 2310/55.73)
- 8 Sec. 2310-220. Findings; rural obstetrical care. The
- 9 General Assembly finds that substantial areas of rural
- 10 Illinois lack adequate access to obstetrical care. The
- 11 primary cause of this problem is the absence of qualified
- 12 practitioners who are willing to offer obstetrical services.
- 13 A significant barrier to recruiting and retaining those
- 14 practitioners is the high cost of professional liability
- insurance for practitioners offering obstetrical care.
- 16 Therefore, the Department, from <u>any</u> funds <u>available</u>
- 17 appropriated for that purpose, <u>must</u> shall award grants to
- 18 physicians practicing obstetrics in rural designated shortage
- 19 areas, as defined in Section 3.04 of the Family Practice
- 20 Residency Act, for the purpose of reimbursing those
- 21 physicians for the costs of obtaining malpractice insurance
- 22 relating to obstetrical services. The Department <u>must</u> shall
- 23 establish reasonable conditions, standards, and duties
- relating to the application for and receipt of the grants.
