- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Governmental Ethics Act is
- 5 amended by changing Section 2-110 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 2-110. Honoraria.
- 8 (a) No member of the General Assembly shall accept any
- 9 honorarium.
- 10 (b) As used in this Section:
- "Honorarium" means a payment of money to a member of the
- 12 General Assembly for an appearance or speech, excluding any
- 13 actual and necessary travel expenses incurred by the member
- of the General Assembly (and one relative), to the extent
- 15 that the payment or those expenses are paid by any other
- 16 person <u>registered under the Lobbyist Registration Act</u>.
- 17 "Honorarium" does not include (i) cash payments made on
- 18 behalf of a member of the General Assembly to an organization
- 19 described under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue
- 20 Code of 1986, (ii) an agent's fee or commission, or (iii)
- 21 funds reported under Article 9 of the Election Code.
- 22 "Travel expense" means the reasonable cost of
- $\,$ 23 $\,$ transportation and the reasonable cost of lodging $\,$ and $\,$ meals
- 24 incurred while a person is away from his or her residence or

- 26 (c) Any honorarium or honoraria accepted in violation of
