1 AN ACT concerning roads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
Section 8.3 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 105/8.3) (from Ch. 127, par. 144.3)

Sec. 8.3. Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the 7 8 State of Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the construction of permanent highways, be set aside and used for 9 the purpose of paying and discharging annually the principal 10 and interest on that bonded indebtedness then due and 11 12 payable, and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in 13 the Road Fund after the payment of principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness then annually due shall be used as 14 15 follows:

16 first -- to pay the cost of administration of 17 Chapters 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, 18 except the cost of administration of Articles I and II of 19 Chapter 3 of that Code; and

20 secondly -- for expenses of the Department of 21 Transportation for construction, reconstruction, 22 improvement, repair, maintenance, operation, and administration of highways in accordance with the 23 provisions of laws relating thereto, or for any purpose 24 related or incident to and connected therewith, including 25 the separation of grades of those highways with railroads 26 27 and with highways and including the payment of awards made by the Industrial Commission under the terms of the 28 Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational 29 Diseases Act for injury or death of an employee of the 30 Division of Highways in the Department of Transportation; 31

1 or for the acquisition of land and the erection of 2 buildings for highway purposes, including the acquisition highway right-of-way or 3 of for investigations to 4 determine the reasonably anticipated future highway 5 needs; or for making of surveys, plans, specifications and estimates for and in the construction and maintenance 6 7 of flight strips and of highways necessary to provide 8 access to military and naval reservations, to defense 9 industries and defense-industry sites, and to the sources of raw materials and for replacing existing highways and 10 11 highway connections shut off from general public use at military and naval reservations and defense-industry 12 sites, or for the purchase of right-of-way, except that 13 the State shall be reimbursed in full for any expense 14 15 incurred in building the flight strips; or for the 16 operating and maintaining of highway garages; or for public highways and 17 patrolling and policing the conserving the peace; or for any of those purposes or any 18 other purpose that may be provided by law. 19

Appropriations for any of those purposes are payable from the Road Fund. Appropriations may also be made from the Road Fund for the administrative expenses of any State agency that are related to motor vehicles or arise from the use of motor vehicles.

25 Beginning with fiscal year 1980 and thereafter, no Road the Fund monies shall be appropriated following 26 to agencies 27 Departments of State government for or administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is 28 29 not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement; 30

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1. Department of Public Health;

32 2. Department of Transportation, only with respect
33 to subsidies for one-half fare Student Transportation and
34 Reduced Fare for Elderly;

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3. Department of Central Management Services,
 except for expenditures incurred for group insurance
 premiums of appropriate personnel;

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4. Judicial Systems and Agencies.

5 Beginning with fiscal year 1981 and thereafter, no Road appropriated to the following 6 Fund monies shall be 7 or agencies of Departments State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is 8 9 a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any not Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: 10

111. Department of State Police, except for12expenditures with respect to the Division of Operations;

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2. Department of Transportation, only with respect to Intercity Rail Subsidies and Rail Freight Services.

Beginning with fiscal year 1982 and thereafter, no Road 15 16 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following State 17 Departments or agencies of government for 18 administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is 19 not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any 20 Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: 21 Department of Central Management Services, except for awards made by the Industrial Commission under the terms of 22 the 23 Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational Diseases Act for injury or death of an employee of the Division of 24 25 Highways in the Department of Transportation.

Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road 26 Fund monies shall appropriated 27 be to the following agencies of State government 28 Departments or for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is 29 30 not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement: 31

Department of State Police, except not more than
 40% of the funds appropriated for the Division of
 Operations;

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2. State Officers.

2 Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to any Department or agency 3 4 of State government for administration, grants, or operations except as provided hereafter; but this limitation is not a 5 6 restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road 7 Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement. Tt. 8 shall not be lawful to circumvent the above appropriation 9 limitations by governmental reorganization or other methods. Appropriations shall be made from the Road Fund only in 10 11 accordance with the provisions of this Section.

Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of 12 Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the construction 13 of permanent highways, be set aside and used for the purpose 14 15 of paying and discharging during each fiscal year the 16 principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness as it. becomes due and payable as provided in the Transportation 17 Bond Act, and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, 18 in 19 the Road Fund after the payment of principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness then annually due shall be used as 20 21 follows:

22 first -- to pay the cost of administration of 23 Chapters 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; and secondly -- no Road Fund monies derived from fees, 24 25 excises, or license taxes relating to registration, operation and use of vehicles on public highways or to 26 fuels used for the propulsion of those vehicles, shall be 27 appropriated or expended other than for costs 28 of administering the laws imposing those fees, excises, and 29 30 license taxes, statutory refunds and adjustments allowed thereunder, administrative costs of the Department of 31 Transportation, payment of debts and liabilities incurred 32 in construction and reconstruction of public highways and 33 bridges, acquisition of rights-of-way for and the cost of 34

1 construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and 2 operation of public highways and bridges under the supervision of the State, political 3 direction and 4 subdivision, or municipality collecting those monies, and the costs for patrolling and policing the public highways 5 (by State, political subdivision, or municipality 6 7 collecting that money) for enforcement of traffic laws. 8 The separation of grades of such highways with railroads 9 and costs associated with protection of at-grade highway and railroad crossing shall also be permissible. 10

11 Appropriations for any of such purposes are payable from the Road Fund or the Grade Crossing Protection Fund as 12 provided in Section 8 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law. 13

Except as provided in this paragraph, beginning with 14 15 fiscal year 1991 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be 16 appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section in excess of its total fiscal year 17 18 1990 Road Fund appropriations for those purposes unless 19 otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act. For fiscal year 2003 only, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the 20 21 Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section in excess of \$97,310,000. It shall not be lawful 22 to 23 circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods unless otherwise provided in 24 25 Section 5q of this Act.

In fiscal year 1994, no Road Fund monies shall be 26 appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of 27 this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 1991 Road 28 Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those 29 30 purposes, plus \$9,800,000. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental 31 32 reorganization or other method.

Beginning with fiscal year 1995 and thereafter, no Road 33 34 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State

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1 for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total 2 fiscal year 1994 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes. It shall not be lawful to 3 4 circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental 5 reorganization or other methods.

б Beginning with fiscal year 2000, total Road Fund 7 appropriations to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section shall not exceed the amounts specified for the 8 9 following fiscal years:

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each year thereafter <u>\$0</u> \$30,500,000. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on 20 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other 21 22 methods.

23 No new program may be initiated in fiscal year 1991 and 24 thereafter that is not consistent with the limitations 25 imposed by this Section for fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, insofar as appropriation of Road Fund monies is concerned. 26

Nothing in this Section prohibits transfers from the Road 27 Fund to the State Construction Account Fund under Section 5e 28 of this Act. 29

Beginning with fiscal year 2005 and thereafter, no Road 30 31 Fund moneys may be appropriated to the Department of Central 32 Management Services, the Department of Employment Security, the Department of Revenue, the Court of Claims, or any other 33 34 State agency (other than the Department of State Police and -7- LRB093 07182 MKM 07337 b

1 the Department of Transportation and, until fiscal year 2008, 2 the Secretary of State) for the purposes of this Section. 3 Appropriations to those entities for those purposes shall, 4 instead, be made from the General Revenue Fund. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by 5 б governmental reorganization or other methods. Nothing in 7 this paragraph prohibits appropriations from the Road Fund to 8 the Department of State Police for the purposes of the 9 highway patrol budget only or the Court of Claims for any 10 claims made against any activities that are funded by the 11 <u>Road Fund.</u>

Beginning with fiscal year 2008 and thereafter, no Road Fund moneys may be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section. Appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes shall, instead, be made from the General Revenue Fund. Is shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods.

19 The additional amounts authorized for expenditure in this 20 Section by this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly 21 shall be repaid to the Road Fund from the General Revenue 22 Fund in the next succeeding fiscal year that the General 23 Revenue Fund has a positive budgetary balance, as determined 24 by generally accepted accounting principles applicable to 25 government.
