- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by
- 5 adding Section 6-32 as follows:
- 6 (235 ILCS 5/6-32 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 6-32. Safety provisions.</u>
- 8 (a) A retailers on premise consumption licensee may not
- 9 permit the use of any pyrotechnic device within its licensed
- 10 premises without the prior authorization of the Illinois
- 11 State Fire Marshal. A retailers on premise consumption
- 12 <u>licensee</u>, or any agent or employee of that licensee, may not
- 13 <u>use mace, pepper spray, or any other toxic air-released</u>
- 14 <u>compound within its licensed premises</u>. <u>Violation of this</u>
- 15 <u>subsection</u> (a) by any licensee or any employee or agent of a
- licensee is a Class 4 felony.
- 17 (b) No person may impede any person who is attempting to
- 18 <u>exit the premises of a retailers on premise consumption</u>
- 19 <u>licensee due to an emergency that constitutes a threat to the</u>
- 20 <u>health or safety of persons within the licensed premises.</u>
- 21 For the purpose of this Section, the term "impede a person
- 22 who is attempting to exit" includes physically restraining
- 23 the person or blocking or locking an exit while the licensed
