- 1 AN ACT concerning the Illinois Military Flags Commission.
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- Section 5. The Military Code of Illinois is amended by 4
- adding Section 25.6 as follows: 5
- 6 (20 ILCS 1805/25.6 new)
- Sec. 25.6. Illinois Military Flags Commission. 7
- (a) The Illinois Military Flags Commission is 8
- established for the purpose of assisting the Adjutant General 9
- with his or her responsibilities under Section 25 of this 10
- Code. The Commission shall advise the Adjutant General on 11
- how to best collect, preserve, and present or display to the 12
- 13 public the colors, flags, guidons, and military trophies of
- war belonging to the State in order to disseminate 14
- information relating to the history of the Illinois National 15
- 16 Guard.

- (b) The Commission consists of 15 members: the Adjutant 17
- 18 General, the State Historian, the Director of the Illinois
- 19 State Museum, and the Director of the Historic Preservation
- one of whom shall be appointed by the President of the

Agency, all ex officio; 4 members of the General Assembly,

- 22 Senate, one by the Minority Leader of the Senate, one by the
- Speaker of the House of Representatives, and one by the 23
- Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; and 7 24
- residents of the State appointed by the Governor. When 25
- appointing members to the Commission, the Governor must 26
- endeavor to appoint persons in a manner to maintain as 27
- 28 regionally diverse a membership as possible. Persons
- appointed to the Commission should provide it with experience 29
- in areas such as, but not limited to, knowledge of military 30
- history, particularly of the American Civil War, and the 31

- 1 education of citizens. Any vacancy in the Commission shall
