1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

ARTICLE 1

Section 5. - 7 be expended in accordance with the terms and conditions upon
- 8 which such funds were received and in the exercise of the
- 9 powers or performance of the duties of the Office of the
- 10 Lieutenant Governor.
- 11 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on July 1,
- 12 2004.
