ARTICLE 2

Section 5. Except as limited by this Section, in each 10 11 instance where there is a line item appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004 to an entity for Personal 12 Services, then, in addition, there is appropriated to that 13 Retirement Contributions 14 entity for Employee Paid by Employer, from the same fund from which the appropriation for 15 Personal Services is made, a dollar amount, or so much of 16 that amount as may be necessary, equal to 4% of the amount 17 Personal Services together 18 appropriated for with an additional 1.5% of the amount of the Personal Services line 19 allocated to salaries payable to employees who qualify for 20 the alternative retirement annuity under Section 14-110 of 21 the Illinois Pension Code or for the retirement annuity 22 available under subsection (g) or (h) of Section 14-108 of 23 24 the Illinois Pension Code (reduced by any other amounts appropriated for that fiscal year to that entity from that 25 Employee Retirement Contributions Paid 26 fund for by Employer). This Section applies only to the extent that the 27 employee retirement contributions are paid on behalf of 28 29 employees who are members of the State Employees' Retirement 30 System.
