 reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the

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Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to 1 units of local government, educational facilities and not-2 3 for-profit organizations for municipal, recreational, educational, and public safety infrastructure improvements and other expenses, including but not limited to training, 5 6 planning, construction, reconstruction, renovation, utilities, and equipment, and all costs associated with 7 economic development programs, educational training 8 programs, community services, public health programs, and 9 10 public safety programs.

Section 1415. The sum of \$21,146, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore made in Article 6, Section 1415 of Public Act 93-0587, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to units of local government, educational facilities and notfor-profit organizations for education and training, infrastructure improvements and other capital projects, limited to including but not planning, construction, reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all associated with economic development programs, costs community service programs, public health programs, public safety programs, and other programs and activities.

Section 1420. The amount of \$9,729,332, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2004, from a reappropriation heretofore made in Article 6, Section 1420 of Public Act 93-0587, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois' Future to the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs for grants to units of government, educational facilities and not-for-profit organizations for education and training,

- 1 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects,
- 2 including but not limited to planning, construction,
- 3 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
- 4 costs associated with economic development programs,
- 5 community service programs, public health programs, public
- 6 safety programs, and other programs and activities.

7 ARTICLE 2

Section 5. Except as limited by this Section, in each 8 9 instance where there is a line item appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004 to an entity for Personal 10 Services, then, in addition, there is appropriated to that 11 entity for Employee Retirement Contributions Paid 12 Employer, from the same fund from which the appropriation for 13 Personal Services is made, a dollar amount, or so much of 14 that amount as may be necessary, equal to 4% of the amount 15 16 appropriated for Personal Services together with additional 1.5% of the amount of the Personal Services line 17 18 allocated to salaries payable to employees who qualify for the alternative retirement annuity under Section 14-110 of 19 the Illinois Pension Code or for the retirement annuity 20 available under subsection (g) or (h) of Section 14-108 of 21 the Illinois Pension Code (reduced by any other amounts 22 23 appropriated for that fiscal year to that entity from that 24 for Employee Retirement Contributions 25 Employer). This Section applies only to the extent that the employee retirement contributions are paid on behalf of 26 employees who are members of the State Employees' Retirement 27 System. The Comptroller shall compute the 28 amount 29 appropriated to each entity under this Section.
