- (a) The enacting clause of the laws of this State shall 15
- 16 be: "Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 17 represented in the General Assembly."
- (b) The General Assembly shall enact laws only by bill. 18
- 19 Bills may originate in either house, but may be amended or
- rejected by the other. 20
- (c) No bill shall become a law without the concurrence 21
- of a majority of the members elected to each house. Final 2.2
- passage of a bill shall be by record vote. In the Senate at 23
- the request of two members, and in the House at the request
- of five members, a record vote may be taken on any other 25
- 26 occasion. A record vote is a vote by yeas and nays entered on
- 27 the journal.

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- (d) A bill shall be read by title on three different 28
- days in each house. A bill and each amendment thereto shall 29
- be reproduced and placed on the desk of each member before 30
- 31 final passage.
- Bills, except bills for appropriations and for the 32

- 1 codification, revision or rearrangement of laws, shall be
- 2 confined to one subject. Appropriation bills shall be limited
- 3 to the subject of appropriations.
- 4 A bill expressly amending a law shall set forth
- 5 completely the sections amended.
- 6 The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
- 7 President of the Senate shall sign each bill that passes both
- 8 houses to certify that the procedural requirements for
- 9 passage have been met.
- 10 (e) After November 2, 2004, no portion of any bill shall
- 11 require a unit of local government or school district to
- 12 <u>establish</u>, <u>expand</u>, <u>modify</u>, <u>or increase its programs</u>,
- 13 <u>activities</u>, or services in such a way as to necessitate the
- 14 <u>expenditure of additional public revenue by a unit of local</u>
- 15 government or school district, unless at least one of the
- 16 <u>following applies:</u>
- 17 (1) the State appropriates additional funds to the
- 18 <u>unit of local government or school district that fully</u>
- 19 <u>fund the additional expenditures necessary to carry out</u>
- 20 <u>the requirement for each year the requirement is in</u>
- 21 <u>effect;</u>
- 22 (2) the bill passes with the concurrence of at
- least three-fifths of the members elected to each house;
- 24 (3) that portion of the bill imposes a federal law
- 25 <u>that the unit of local government or school district</u>
- 26 <u>would otherwise be required to meet by federal law or</u>
- 27 <u>imposes a State or federal court order, with no</u>
- 28 <u>additional requirements imposed by the State;</u>
- 29 <u>(4) that portion of the bill creates, expands, or</u>
- modifies a specifically defined crime; or
- 31 (5) that portion of the bill creates, expands, or
- 32 <u>modifies benefits paid by employers to unemployed workers</u>
- or for employees or dependents for workplace injuries if
- the benefits apply uniformly to all employees, public and

- 2 <u>A law enacted after November 2, 2004 may not be the basis</u>
- 3 for administrative rules, regulations, or actions that
- 4 require a unit of local government or school district to
- 5 <u>establish</u>, <u>expand</u>, <u>modify</u>, <u>or increase its programs</u>,
- 6 <u>activities</u>, or <u>services</u> in <u>such</u> a <u>way</u> as to <u>necessitate</u> the
- 7 <u>expenditure of additional public revenue by a unit of local</u>
- 8 government or school district, unless the law authorizes the
- 9 <u>rules, regulations, or actions.</u>
- 10 This subsection (e) does not apply to any portion of a
- 11 <u>bill that limits or regulates the ability of a unit of local</u>
- 12 government or school district to raise revenue.
