11 WHEREAS, He later became the Chouteau Island Project 12 Manager for Southwestern Illinois Resource, Conservation and 13 Development Inc., and most recently, he was the Executive 14 Director of the Metro East Park and Recreation District; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Polivick was active in many community and 16 civic organizations; he was a member of the Illinois Association of Park Districts and a Founder and Treasurer of 17 18 the Board of Directors of Solid Granite, a nonprofit corporation advocating community development and civic growth, 19 the Granite City Rotary Club, the Southern Illinois Greenways 20 and Trails Steering Committee, the Illinois Trail Council, and 21 22 the Illinois Conservation Congress, where he voted as a 23 representative delegate; and

24 WHEREAS, He was a member of the Board of Regents and 25 instructor for the Professional Developmental School for the 26 Illinois Park and Recreation Association; and he was a member 27 of Hope Luthern Church in Granite City; and
