## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

110 ILCS 947/65.27 new

Amends the Higher Education Student Assistance Act. Requires the Illinois Student Assistance Commission to implement and administer a teacher scholarship program, to be known as the Teach Illinois Scholarship Program. Defines "area of identified staff shortage" as a school district in which the number of teachers is insufficient to meet student or school district demand or a subject area for which the number of teachers who are qualified to teach that subject area is insufficient to meet student or school district demand, as determined by the State Board of Education. Requires the Commission to annually award scholarships to persons preparing to teach in areas of identified staff shortages. Requires the recipient to accept employment to teach in an elementary or secondary school in Illinois in an area of identified staff shortage for a period of at least 5 years.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is
amended by adding Section 65.27 as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 947/65.27 new)

7 <u>Sec. 65.27. Teach Illinois Scholarship Program.</u>

8 (a) For the purposes of this Section:

9 <u>"Area of identified staff shortage" means a school district</u> 10 <u>in which the number of teachers is insufficient to meet student</u> 11 <u>or school district demand or a subject area for which the</u> 12 <u>number of teachers who are qualified to teach that subject area</u> 13 <u>is insufficient to meet student or school district demand, as</u> 14 <u>determined by the State Board of Education.</u>

"Qualified institution of higher learning" means one of the
 universities listed in Section 65.40 of this Act.

17 (b) The Commission shall implement and administer a teacher scholarship program, to be known as the Teach Illinois 18 19 Scholarship Program. The Commission shall annually award scholarships to persons preparing to teach in areas of 20 21 identified staff shortages. These scholarships shall be issued 22 to individuals who make application to the Commission and who agree to take courses at qualified institutions of higher 23 learning that will prepare them to teach in areas of identified 24 25 staff shortages.

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(c) Scholarships awarded under this Section shall be issued pursuant to rules promulgated by the Commission.

28 (d) Each scholarship shall be utilized by its holder for 29 the payment of tuition and non-revenue bond fees at any 30 gualified institution of higher learning. Such tuition and fees 31 shall be available only for courses that will enable the 32 individual to be certified to teach in areas of identified HB0060

staff shortages. The Commission shall determine which courses
 are eligible for tuition payments under this Section.

3 <u>(e) The Commission may make tuition payments directly to</u> 4 <u>the qualified institution of higher learning that the</u> 5 <u>individual attends for the courses prescribed.</u>

(f) Following the completion of the program of study, the 6 7 individual must accept employment to teach in an elementary or secondary school in Illinois in an area of identified staff 8 shortage for a period of at least 5 years. Individuals who fail 9 to comply with this provision shall refund all of the awarded 10 11 scholarships to the Commission, whether payments were made 12 directly to the institutions of higher learning or to the individuals, and this condition shall be agreed to in writing 13 by all scholarship recipients at the time the scholarship is 14 awarded. No individual shall be required to refund tuition 15 16 payments if his or her failure to obtain employment as a 17 teacher in a school is the result of financial conditions within school districts. The rules promulgated as provided in 18 19 this Section shall contain provisions regarding the waiving and 20 deferral of such payments.

21 (g) The Commission, with the cooperation of the State Board 22 of Education, shall assist individuals who have participated in 23 the scholarship program established by this Section in finding 24 employment in areas of identified staff shortages.

25 (h) Appropriations for the scholarships outlined in this 26 Section shall be made to the Commission by the General 27 Describly
