SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the School Code. Provides that no one may teach in the public schools of this State who is not state-certified and highly qualified as defined in the federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Provides that residency within a school district must be considered in determining the employment and compensation of a teacher and whether to retain, promote, assign, or transfer that teacher (now, there is a general prohibition). Amends the State Mandates Act to require implementation without reimbursement. Effective August 15, 2005.

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AN ACT regarding education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Sections
21-1, 24-4.1, and 34-83.1 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21-1) (from Ch. 122, par. 21-1)

Sec. 21-1. Qualification of teachers. No one may teach in
the public schools of this State who is not state-certified and
highly qualified as defined in the federal No Child Left Behind
Act of 2001.

No one may be certified to teach or supervise in the 11 public schools of this State who is not of good character, of 12 good health, a citizen of the United States or legally present 13 14 and authorized for employment, and at least 19 years of age. An 15 applicant for a certificate who is not a citizen of the United States must sign and file with the State Board of Education a 16 17 letter of intent indicating that either (i) within 10 years 18 after the date that the letter is filed or (ii) at the earliest 19 opportunity after the person becomes eligible to apply for U.S. citizenship, the person will apply for U.S. citizenship. 20

21 Citizenship is not required for the issuance of a temporary 22 part-time certificate to participants in approved training 23 programs for exchange students as described in Section 21-10.2. 24 A certificate issued under this plan shall expire on June 30 25 following the date of issue. One renewal for one year is 26 authorized if the holder remains as an official participant in 27 an approved exchange program.

In determining good character under this Section, any felony conviction of the applicant may be taken into consideration, but such a conviction shall not operate as a bar to registration.

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No person otherwise qualified shall be denied the right to

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be certified, to receive training for the purpose of becoming a teacher or to engage in practice teaching in any school because of a physical disability including but not limited to visual and hearing disabilities; nor shall any school district refuse to employ a teacher on such grounds, provided that the person is able to carry out the duties of the position for which he applies.

No person may be granted or continue to hold a teaching 8 9 certificate who has knowingly altered or misrepresented his or 10 her teaching qualifications in order to acquire the 11 certificate. Any other certificate held by such person may be 12 suspended or revoked by the State Teacher Certification Board, 13 depending upon the severity of the alteration or 14 misrepresentation.

15 No one may teach or supervise in the public schools nor 16 receive for teaching or supervising any part of any public 17 school fund, who does not hold a certificate of qualification granted by the State Board of Education or by the State Teacher 18 19 Certification Board and a regional superintendent of schools as 20 hereinafter provided, or by the board of education of a city having a population exceeding 500,000 inhabitants except as 21 provided in Section 34-6 and in Section 10-22.34 or Section 22 23 10-22.34b. However, the provisions of this Article do not apply to a member of the armed forces who is employed as a teacher of 24 subjects in the Reserve Officer's Training Corps of any school. 25 26 Sections 21-2 through 21-24 do not apply to cities having a 27 population exceeding 500,000 inhabitants, until July 1, 1988.

28 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the board 29 of education of any school district may grant to a teacher of 30 the district a leave of absence with full pay for a period of 31 not more than one year to permit such teacher to teach in a 32 foreign state under the provisions of the Exchange Teacher Program established under Public Law 584, 79th Congress, and 33 Public Law 402, 80th Congress, as amended. The school board 34 35 granting such leave of absence may employ with or without pay a 36 national of the foreign state wherein the teacher on leave of

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absence will teach, if the national is qualified to teach in that foreign state, and if that national will teach in a grade level similar to the one which was taught in such foreign state. The State Board of Education shall promulgate and enforce such reasonable rules as may be necessary to effectuate this paragraph.

Sec. 34-83.1. Residence requirements. Residency within <u>a</u> any school district governed by this Article <u>must</u>, if not required at the time of employment as a qualification of employment, shall not be considered in determining <u>the</u> <u>employment and the</u> compensation of a teacher <u>and</u> or whether to retain, promote, assign, or transfer that teacher.

22 Section 90. The State Mandates Act is amended by adding 23 Section 8.29 as follows:

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(30 ILCS 805/8.29 new)

25 Sec. 8.29. Exempt mandate. Notwithstanding Sections 6 and 8
26 of this Act, no reimbursement by the State is required for the
27 implementation of any mandate created by this amendatory Act of
28 the 94th General Assembly.

29 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect August30 15, 2005.
