## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of Corrections Offenders, Significant Others, and Family Act. Provides that the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Health shall jointly develop and implement an HIV/AIDS prevention education program targeted to offenders incarcerated in Department of Corrections facilities, significant others, and family of adult and juvenile prison inmates. Provides that the Illinois Department of Corrections shall: (1) provide, in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities and prisons, printed information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases and referral information to community-based-providers of HIV/AIDS prevention, HIV/AIDS treatment, and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing services throughout Illinois; (2) display in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities and prisons an HIV/AIDS informational video, produced by a national organization with expertise in HIV/AIDS prevention; (3) provide written information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates upon entrance to a detention center or prison and offer voluntary HIV/AIDS testing to all inmates; and (4) provide written information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates just prior to their release from custody and referral to appropriate community based organizations that provide HIV/AIDS services and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing. Provides that one year after implementation of this Act, the Illinois Department of Corrections shall report to the Illinois General Assembly on the effectiveness of this program in increasing voluntary HIV/AIDS testing. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of Corrections
Offenders, Significant Others, and Family Act.

Section 5. Definition. In this Act, "HIV/AIDS" means the human immunodeficiency virus or any other identified causative agent of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.

10 Section 10. HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of Corrections Offenders, Significant Others, and Family. The 11 Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Health 12 13 shall jointly develop and implement an HIV/AIDS prevention 14 education program targeted to offenders incarcerated in Department of Corrections facilities, significant others, and 15 16 family of adult and juvenile prison inmates. Through this program, the Illinois Department of Corrections shall: (1) 17 18 provide, in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities and prisons, printed information on the transmission and 19 prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually 20 diseases 21 transmitted referral information and to 22 community-based-providers of HIV/AIDS prevention, HIV/AIDS treatment, and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing 23 services 24 throughout Illinois; (2) display in all public waiting rooms of 25 detention facilities and prisons an HIV/AIDS informational video, produced by a national organization with expertise in 26 27 HIV/AIDS prevention; (3) provide written information on the 28 transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other 29 sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates upon entrance to a detention center or prison and offer voluntary HIV/AIDS testing 30 to all inmates; and (4) provide written information on the 31

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transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates just prior to their release from custody and referral to appropriate community based organizations that provide HIV/AIDS services and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing.

6 Section 15. Report to the General Assembly. One year after 7 implementation of this Act, the Illinois Department of 8 Corrections shall report to the General Assembly on the 9 effectiveness of this program in increasing voluntary HIV/AIDS 10 testing.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
