## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

70 ILCS 2205/19.5 new

70 ILCS 2305/16.5 new

70 ILCS 3020/25 new

Amends the Sanitary District Act of 1907, the North Shore Sanitary District Act, the Sanitary District Act of 1917, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Act, the Sanitary District Act of 1936, the Metro-East Sanitary District Act of 1974, and the Eastern Will Sanitary District Act. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, requires a sanitary district that locates its facilities within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a crossing along the public roads of this State, to pay the railroad a one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. Provides that the standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for its direct expenses incurred as a result of the crossing. Requires the district to also reimburse the railroad for any actual flagging expenses associated with the crossing in addition to the standard crossing fee. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Sanitary District Act of 1907 is amended by adding Section 19.5 as follows:
- 6 (70 ILCS 2205/19.5 new)
- Sec. 19.5. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed 7 8 by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a 9 crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the 10 Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a 11 one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The 12 standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other 13 fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct 14 15 expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing. The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual 16 17 flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the 18 standard crossing fee.
- 19 Section 10. The North Shore Sanitary District Act is 20 amended by adding Section 16.5 as follows:
- 21 (70 ILCS 2305/16.5 new)
- Sec. 16.5. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed 22 by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities 23 24 within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the 25 Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a 26 one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The 27 28 standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct 29 expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing. 30

- 2 flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the
- 3 standard crossing fee.
- 4 Section 15. The Sanitary District Act of 1917 is amended by
- 5 adding Section 13.5 as follows:
- 6 (70 ILCS 2405/13.5 new)
- 7 Sec. 13.5. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed
- 8 by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities
- 9 within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a
- 10 crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the
- 11 Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a
- one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The
- 13 <u>standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other</u>
- 14 <u>fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct</u>
- 15 <u>expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing.</u>
- 16 The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual
- flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the
- 18 <u>standard crossing fee.</u>
- 19 Section 20. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District
- 20 Act is amended by adding Section 37 as follows:
- 21 (70 ILCS 2605/37 new)

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- Sec. 37. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed by
- 23 <u>the parties</u>, a sanitary district that locates its facilities
- 24 within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a
- 25 <u>crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the</u>
- 26 <u>Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a</u>
- 27 <u>one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The</u>
- 29 fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct

standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other

expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing.

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- 31 The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual
- 32 <u>flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the</u>

2 Section 25. The Sanitary District Act of 1936 is amended by 3 adding Section 24a as follows:

(70 ILCS 2805/24a new)

Sec. 24a. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing. The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the standard crossing fee.

Section 30. The Metro-East Sanitary District Act of 1974 is amended by adding Section 2-11 as follows:

19 (70 ILCS 2905/2-11 new)

Sec. 2-11. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing. The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the standard crossing fee.

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Section 35. The Eastern Will Sanitary District Act is 1 2 amended by adding Section 25 as follows:

(70 ILCS 3020/25 new) 3

> Sec. 25. Standard crossing fee. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, a sanitary district that locates its facilities within the railroad right-of-way for a crossing, other than a crossing along the public roads of the State pursuant to the Telephone Line Right of Way Act, shall pay the railroad a one-time standard crossing fee of \$750 for each crossing. The standard crossing fee is in lieu of any license or any other fees or charges to reimburse the railroad for the direct expenses incurred by the railroad as a result of the crossing. The district shall also reimburse the railroad for any actual flagging expenses associated with a crossing in addition to the standard crossing fee.

> Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
