## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act 30 ILCS 105/5.640 new 35 ILCS 5/507EE new 35 ILCS 5/509 35 ILCS 5/510

Creates the Epilepsy Disease Assistance Act and amends the State Finance Act and the Illinois Income Tax Act. Requires the Department of Public Health and Department of Public Aid to develop certain standards and programs concerning epilepsy. Provides for an Epilepsy Advisory Committee to advise the Departments on their duties under the Act. Provides for the establishment of two regional epilepsy centers. Provides that the Department of Public Health shall provide grants-in-aid to the regional epilepsy centers for necessary educational activities and research, and for the development and maintenance of services for victims of epilepsy and their families. Creates the Regional Epilepsy Center Grants-in-Aid Fund as a special fund in the State treasury for the purpose of funding certain grants-in-aid, and authorizes an Illinois income tax checkoff for contributions to the fund. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Epilepsy Disease Assistance Act.

Section 5. Policy declaration. The General Assembly finds 6 7 that epilepsy is a devastating health condition that afflicts 2,300,000 United States citizens, over 125,000 of whom reside 8 in Illinois. The General Assembly also finds that epilepsy 9 afflicts its victims at all ages, but is particularly 10 devastating to children and the elderly. It is the opinion of 11 the General Assembly that epilepsy can cause serious financial, 12 social, and emotional hardships on the victims and their 13 14 families of such a major consequence that it is essential for 15 the State to develop and implement policies, plans, programs, and services to alleviate these hardships. 16

17 It is the intent of the General Assembly through 18 implementation of this Act to establish a program for the 19 conduct of education and research regarding the cause, cure, and treatment of both the physiologic and psychosocial aspects 20 of epilepsy. Additionally, it is the intent of the General 21 Assembly, through a comprehensive, state-wide system of 22 23 community-based services (Regional Epilepsy Centers), to 24 provide for the identification, evaluation, diagnosis, 25 referral, and treatment of victims of this disease.

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Section 10. Duties of the Departments.

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(a) The Department of Public Health shall:

(1) Assist in the development and expansion of programs
for the care and treatment of persons suffering from
epilepsy, particularly children and the elderly.

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(2) Institute and carry on an educational program among

1 health care professionals, teachers, school administers, 2 public health departments, and families, including the dissemination of information and 3 the conducting of educational programs to assist in the recognition and 4 5 referral of persons for appropriate followup and 6 treatment.

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(b) The Department of Public Aid shall:

8 (1) Develop standards for determining eligibility for 9 care and treatment under this program. Among other 10 standards so developed under this paragraph, candidates, 11 to be eligible, must be referred and evaluated by a program 12 properly staffed and equipped.

13 (2) Extend financial assistance to persons suffering
 14 from epilepsy and also provide reasonable charges and fees
 15 for:

16 (i) referral and evaluation for appropriate care17 and treatment; and

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(ii) diagnosis and treatment by an epileptologist.

19 Section 15. Epilepsy Advisory Committee. The Epilepsy Advisory Committee is created as a joint committee within the 20 Department of Public Aid and within the Department of Public 21 22 Health. The Epilepsy Advisory Committee shall consist of the 23 Directors of Public Aid and Public Health, or their respective 24 designees, who shall serve as non-voting members and who shall be the co-chairs of the Committee, and 11 voting members 25 26 appointed by the Governor.

shall include 27 voting members persons who The are 28 experienced in the delivery of diagnoses, treatment, and 29 support services to victims of epilepsy and their families. Voting members shall include 3 physicians licensed to practice 30 31 medicine in all of its branches, at least one of whom shall be is board-certified in 32 physician who neurology; one а educational institution that 33 representative of an is with medical center 34 affiliated а in the State; one 35 representative of a licensed hospital; one nurse; one social

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worker; one representative of an organization established under the Illinois Insurance Code for the purpose of providing health insurance; one representative of the Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Chicago; and 2 victims of epilepsy or members of their families.

Each voting member shall serve for a term of 2 years and 6 until his or her successor is appointed and qualified. Members 7 of the Committee shall not be compensated, but shall be 8 reimbursed for expenses actually incurred in the performance of 9 10 their duties from funds appropriated for that purpose. No more 11 than 7 voting members may be of the same political party. 12 Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments. 13

14 The Epilepsy Advisory Committee shall advise the 15 Department of Public Health and the Department of Public Aid on 16 their duties under this Act.

17 Section 20. Regional Committees. The Epilepsy Committee 18 shall recommend the establishment of 2 Regional Epilepsy 19 Centers for providing community services to victims of epilepsy 20 and their families.

21 Section 25. Regional Epilepsy Center Grants-in-Aid. The 22 Regional Epilepsy Center Grants-in-Aid Fund is created as a 23 special fund in the State treasury. From appropriations from 24 the Fund and from other sources made available by the General 25 Assembly, the Department of Public Health shall provide 26 grants-in-aid to Regional Epilepsy Centers for necessary 27 educational activities and research and for the development and 28 maintenance of services for victims of epilepsy and their 29 families. The Department shall adopt rules governing the 30 distribution and specific purpose of these grants.

31 Section 30. The State Finance Act is amended by adding 32 Section 5.640 as follows: HB0788

3 Fund.

4 Section 35. The Illinois Income Tax Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 509 and 510 and by adding Section 507EE as 6 follows:

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(35 ILCS 5/507EE new)

Sec. 507EE. Regional Epilepsy Center Grants-in-Aid Fund 8 9 checkoff. The Department must print on its standard individual 10 income tax form a provision indicating that if the taxpayer wishes to contribute to the Regional Epilepsy Center 11 Grants-in-Aid Fund, as authorized by this amendatory Act of the 12 13 94th General Assembly, he or she may do so by stating the 14 amount of the contribution (not less than \$1) on the return and 15 that the contribution will reduce the taxpayer's refund or increase the amount of payment to accompany the return. Failure 16 to remit any amount of increased payment reduces the 17 contribution accordingly. This Section does not apply to any 18 amended return. 19

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#### (35 ILCS 5/509) (from Ch. 120, par. 5-509)

Sec. 509. Tax checkoff explanations. All individual income 21 22 tax return forms shall contain appropriate explanations and 23 spaces to enable the taxpayers to designate contributions to 24 the following funds: the Child Abuse Prevention Fund, the 25 Illinois Wildlife Preservation Fund (as required by the Illinois Non-Game Wildlife Protection Act), the Alzheimer's 26 27 Disease Research Fund (as required by the Alzheimer's Disease 28 Research Act), the Assistance to the Homeless Fund (as required 29 by this Act), the Penny Severns Breast and Cervical Cancer Research Fund, the National World War II Memorial Fund, the 30 Prostate Cancer Research Fund, the Lou Gehrig's Disease (ALS) 31 Research Fund, the Multiple Sclerosis Assistance Fund, the 32 Leukemia Treatment and Education Fund, the World War II 33

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Illinois Veterans Memorial Fund, the Korean War Veterans
 National Museum and Library Fund, the Illinois Military Family
 Relief Fund, the Illinois Veterans' Homes Fund, <u>the Regional</u>
 <u>Epilepsy Center Grants-in-Aid Fund</u>, and the Asthma and Lung
 Research Fund.

Each form shall contain a statement that the contributions will reduce the taxpayer's refund or increase the amount of payment to accompany the return. Failure to remit any amount of increased payment shall reduce the contribution accordingly.

10 If, on October 1 of any year, the total contributions to 11 any one of the funds made under this Section do not equal 12 \$100,000 or more, the explanations and spaces for designating 13 contributions to the fund shall be removed from the individual 14 income tax return forms for the following and all subsequent 15 years and all subsequent contributions to the fund shall be 16 refunded to the taxpayer.

22 510. Determination of amounts contributed. Sec. The 23 Department shall determine the total amount contributed to each of the following: the Child Abuse Prevention Fund, the Illinois 24 25 Wildlife Preservation Fund, the Assistance to the Homeless 26 Fund, the Alzheimer's Disease Research Fund, the Penny Severns 27 Breast and Cervical Cancer Research Fund, the National World War II Memorial Fund, the Prostate Cancer Research Fund, the 28 29 Illinois Military Family Relief Fund, the Lou Gehrig's Disease (ALS) Research Fund, the Multiple Sclerosis Assistance Fund, 30 the Leukemia Treatment and Education Fund, the World War II 31 Illinois Veterans Memorial Fund, the Korean War Veterans 32 National Museum and Library Fund, the Illinois Veterans' Homes 33 Fund, the Regional Epilepsy Grants-in-Aid Fund, and the Asthma 34 and Lung Research Fund; and shall notify the State Comptroller 35

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and the State Treasurer of the amounts to be transferred from the General Revenue Fund to each fund, and upon receipt of such notification the State Treasurer and Comptroller shall transfer the amounts.
