SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 220/6

from Ch. 127, par. 746

Amends the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act. Provides that an intergovernmental self-insurance agreement, cooperative, or pool does not interfere with statutory obligations of collective bargaining. Makes it unlawful for an intergovernmental joint insurance pool or cooperative to discriminate or retaliate against public agency members that limit their participation in the pool or cooperative as a result of collective bargaining obligations. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

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Section 5. The Intergovernmental Cooperation Act is amended by changing Section 6 as follows:

6 (5 ILCS 220/6) (from Ch. 127, par. 746)

6. 7 Sec. Joint self-insurance. An intergovernmental 8 contract may, among other undertakings, authorize public agencies to jointly self-insure and authorize each public 9 agency member of the contract to utilize its funds to pay to a 10 joint insurance pool its costs and reserves to protect, wholly 11 or partially, itself or any public agency member of the 12 contract against liability or loss in the designated insurable 13 14 area. A joint insurance pool shall have an annual audit 15 performed by an independent certified public accountant and shall file an annual audited financial report with the Director 16 17 of Insurance no later than 150 days after the end of the pool's immediately preceding fiscal year. The Director of Insurance 18 19 shall issue rules necessary to implement this audit and report 20 requirement. The rule shall establish the due date for filing the initial annual audited financial report. Within 30 days 21 22 after January 1, 1991, and within 30 days after each January 1 23 thereafter, public agencies that are jointly self-insured to protect against liability under the Workers' Compensation Act 24 25 and the Workers' Occupational Diseases Act shall file with the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission a report indicating 26 an election to self-insure. 27

For purposes of this Section, "public agency member" means any public agency defined or created under this Act, any local public entity as defined in Section 1-206 of the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act, and any public agency, authority, instrumentality, council, board, - 2 - LRB094 03826 JAM 33837 b

1 service region, district, unit, bureau, or, commission, or any 2 municipal corporation, college, or university, whether corporate or otherwise, and any other local governmental body 3 or similar entity that is presently existing or created after 4 5 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 6 Assembly, whether or not specified in this Section. Only public 7 agency members with tax receipts, tax revenues, taxing 8 authority, or other resources sufficient to pay costs and to service debt related to intergovernmental activities described 9 10 in this Section, or public agency members created by or as part 11 of a public agency with these powers, may enter into contracts 12 or otherwise associate among themselves as permitted in this 13 Section.

No joint insurance pool or other intergovernmental 14 cooperative shall interfere with the statutory obligation of 15 16 any public agency member to bargain over or to reach agreement 17 with a labor organization over a mandatory subject of collective bargaining as those terms are used in the Illinois 18 Public Labor Relations Act. No intergovernmental contract of 19 20 insurance shall limit the rights or obligations of public agency members to engage in collective bargaining, and it shall 21 be unlawful for a joint insurance pool or other 22 23 intergovernmental cooperative to discriminate against public agency members or otherwise retaliate against such members for 24 limiting their participation in a joint insurance pool as a 25 result of a collective bargaining agreement. 26
