

94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB1044

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Public Health Program Beneficiary Employer Disclosure Act. Provides that an applicant for benefits under Medicaid or the Children's Health Insurance Program, or a person requesting uncompensated care in a hospital, must identify the employer or employers of the proposed beneficiary of the health care benefits provided under that program. Requires the Department of Public Aid to submit to the General Assembly an annual report, beginning in 2007, identifying all such identified employers who employ 25 or more public health program beneficiaries. Provides for public access to the report.

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1 AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Public
- 5 Health Program Beneficiary Employer Disclosure Act.
- Section 5. Definition. In this Act, "public health program"
 means either of the following:
- 8 (1) The medical assistance program under Article V of 9 the Illinois Public Aid Code.
- 10 (2) The children's health insurance program under the
 11 Children's Health Insurance Program Act.
 - Section 10. Disclosure of employer required. An applicant for health care benefits under a public health program, or a person requesting uncompensated care in a hospital, must identify the employer or employers of the proposed beneficiary of the health care benefits. If the proposed public health program beneficiary is not employed, the applicant must identify the employer or employers of any adult who is responsible for providing all or some of the proposed beneficiary's support.
- 21 Section 15. Reporting of disclosed information.
- (a) On or before March 1 of each year, beginning in 2007, 22 the Department of Public Aid shall submit to the General 23 Assembly a report identifying all employers identified under 24 10 who employ 25 or more public health program 25 26 beneficiaries. In determining whether the 27 threshold is met, the Department shall include all public 28 health program beneficiaries employed by the employer and its subsidiaries at all locations within the State. The report 29 shall include (i) each employer's name (and, as appropriate, 30

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1 the names of its subsidiaries that employ public health program 2 beneficiaries), (ii) its location or locations in the State, 3 (iii) the total number of its employees and dependents who are 4 enrolled in each public health program, and (iv) the total cost to the State of providing benefits under a public health 5 program for the employees and enrolled dependents of each named 6 7 employer. The report shall not include the name of any 8 individual public health program beneficiary and confidential and subject to the Health Insurance Portability 9 10 and Accountability Act of 1996.

(b) In addition to filing the report with the General Assembly, the Department shall make the report available to the public by posting the report on the Department's official website. The Department also shall make a copy of the report available to a member of the public upon request.
