SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 605/605-417 new

Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law. Provides that the Department may create a program for the assistance of Illinois manufacturers and other businesses to become accredited in approved international standardization organizations. Provides that the program is subject to appropriation and may allow for the collaboration of statewide manufacturing extension organizations and other providers of programs offering certification in international standardization organizations. Allows the Department to promulgate rules regarding all aspects of the program. Defines "international standardization organization".

AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic
Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
amended by adding Section 605-417 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 605/605-417 new)

8 <u>Sec. 605-417. International standardization assistance</u>
9 program.

The Department may create a program for the assistance of 10 Illinois manufacturers and other businesses to become 11 accredited and reaccredited in approved international 12 standardization organizations. This program is subject to 13 appropriation and may provide for the collaboration of 14 15 statewide manufacturing extension organizations and other providers of programs offering certification in international 16 17 standardization organizations.

18 <u>The Department may promulgate rules regarding all aspects</u>
 19 <u>of the program of assistance provided for in this Section.</u>

For the purposes of this Section, an "international 20 standardization organization" shall mean a recognized body 21 that provides, for common and repeated use, rules, 22 specifications, and criteria to be applied consistently in the 23 classification of materials, in the manufacture and supply of 24 products, in testing and analysis, in terminology, and in the 25 26 provision of services and may include a reference framework or a common technological language between suppliers and their 27 customers that facilitates trade and the transfer of 28 29 technology.
