Amends the Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act. Makes a technical change to a Section concerning the purpose of the Act.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Health Facilities Planning Act is
amended by changing Section 2 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 3960/2) (from Ch. 111 1/2, par. 1152)

(Section scheduled to be repealed on July 1, 2008)

Sec. 2. The The purpose of this Act is to establish a 8 procedure designed to reverse the trends of increasing costs of 9 10 health care resulting from unnecessary construction or modification of health care facilities. Such procedure shall 11 represent an attempt by the State of Illinois to improve the 12 financial ability of the public to obtain necessary health 13 14 services, and to establish an orderly and comprehensive health 15 care delivery system which will guarantee the availability of quality health care to the general public. 16

17 This Act shall establish a procedure (1) which requires a person establishing, constructing or modifying a health care 18 19 facility, as herein defined, to have the qualifications, 20 background, character and financial resources to adequately provide a proper service for the community; (2) that promotes 21 22 through the process of recognized local and areawide health 23 facilities planning, the orderly and economic development of health care facilities in the State of Illinois that avoids 24 unnecessary duplication of such facilities; (3) that promotes 25 planning for and development of health care facilities needed 26 for comprehensive health care especially in areas where the 27 28 health planning process has identified unmet needs; and (4) 29 that carries out these purposes in coordination with the Agency 30 and the comprehensive State health plan developed by that 31 Agency.
