SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-212

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that, in the study of traffic stops that is being conducted until December 31, 2007, the information gathered during each stop shall include whether or not a dog was used in the course of a search. Provides that, if a dog was used in the course of a search, the study shall note the results of the search. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Section 11-212 as follows:

Sec. 11-212. Traffic stop statistical study.

8 (a) From January 1, 2004 until December 31, 2007, whenever 9 a State or local law enforcement officer issues a uniform 10 traffic citation or warning citation for an alleged violation 11 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall record at least 12 the following:

(1) the name, address, gender, and the officer's
subjective determination of the race of the person stopped;
the person's race shall be selected from the following
list: Caucasian, African-American, Hispanic, Native
American/Alaska Native, or Asian/Pacific Islander;

(3) the make and year of the vehicle stopped;

(6) whether or not a search contemporaneous to the stop

(2) if a dog was used in the course of a search of the vehicle, the results of that search. 6

The Illinois Department of Transportation shall 7 (C) provide a standardized law enforcement data compilation form on 8 9 its website.

(d) Every law enforcement agency shall, by March 1 in each 10 of the years 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007, compile the data 11 12 described in subsections (a) and (b) on the standardized law enforcement data compilation form provided by the Illinois 13 Department of Transportation and transmit the data to the 14 Department. 15

16 (e) The Illinois Department of Transportation shall 17 analyze the data provided by law enforcement agencies required by this Section and submit a report of the findings to the 18 19 Governor, the General Assembly, and each law enforcement agency 20 no later than July 1 in each of the years 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2008. The Illinois Department of Transportation may contract 21 with an outside entity for the analysis of the data provided. 22 23 In analyzing the data collected under this Section, the analyzing entity shall scrutinize the data for evidence of 24 statistically significant aberrations. The following list, 25 26 which is illustrative, and not exclusive, contains examples of 27 areas in which statistically significant aberrations may be found: 28

(1) The percentage of minority drivers or passengers being stopped in a given area is substantially higher than the proportion of the overall population in or traveling through the area that the minority constitutes.

(2) A substantial number of false stops including stops 33 not resulting in the issuance of a traffic ticket or the 34 making of an arrest. 35

(3) A disparity between the proportion of citations

1 issued to minorities and proportion of minorities in the 2 population.

(4) A disparity among the officers of the same law 3 enforcement agency with regard to the number of minority 4 5 drivers or passengers being stopped in a given area.

6 (5) A disparity between the frequency of searches performed on minority drivers and the frequency of searches performed on non-minority drivers.

(f) Any law enforcement officer identification information 9 or driver identification information that is compiled by any 10 11 law enforcement agency or the Illinois Department of 12 Transportation pursuant to this Act for the purposes of requirements 13 fulfilling the of this Section shall be confidential and exempt from public inspection and copying, as 14 15 provided under Section 7 of the Freedom of Information Act, and 16 the information shall not be transmitted to anyone except as needed to comply with this Section. This Section shall not 17 exempt those materials that, prior to the effective date of 18 19 this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, were available under the Freedom of Information Act. 20

(g) Funding to implement this Section shall come from 21 22 federal highway safety funds available to Illinois, as directed 23 by the Governor.

Illinois of 24 (h) The Department Transportation, in consultation with law enforcement agencies, officials, 25 and 26 organizations, including Illinois chiefs of police, the 27 Department of State Police, the Illinois Sheriffs Association, 28 and the Chicago Police Department, and community groups and 29 other experts, shall undertake a study to determine the best 30 use of technology to collect, compile, and analyze the traffic 31 stop statistical study data required by this Section. The 32 Department shall report its findings and recommendations to the 33 Governor and the General Assembly by March 1, 2004.
