Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

24	Section 20. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as
25	may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation
26	Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for
27	disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance
28	Registration Program to be distributed to: (1) participating
29	states, provided that no distributions exceed funds made
30	available from registration collections; and (2) for refunds
31	for overpayments.

32 Section 25. The sum of \$1,781,200, or so much thereof as

- 1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Public Utility
- 2 Fund to assist the Illinois Commerce Commission in
- 3 implementing the Electric Service Customer Choice and Rate
- 4 Relief Law of 1997, including costs in the prior year.
- 5 Section 30. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as
- 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Digital Divide
- 7 Elimination Infrastructure Fund to the Illinois Commerce
- 8 Commission for grants and awards for the construction of
- 9 high-speed data transmission facilities.
- 10 Section 35. The sum of \$74,000, or so much thereof as
- 11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground
- 12 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois
- 13 Commerce Commission for a grant to the Statewide One-call
- 14 Notice System, as required in the Illinois Underground
- 15 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Act.
- 16 The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may be
- 17 necessary, is appropriated from the Underground Utility
- 18 Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois Commerce
- 19 Commission for refunds.
- Section 40. The sum of \$42,900,000, or so much thereof
- 21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless
- 22 Service Emergency Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission
- 23 for grants to emergency telephone system boards, qualified
- 24 government entities, or the Department of State Police for
- 25 the design, implementation, operation, maintenance, or
- 26 upgrade of wireless 9-1-1 or E9-1-1 emergency services and
- 27 public safety answering points and for reimbursement of the
- 28 Communications Revolving Fund for administrative costs
- 29 incurred by the Illinois Commerce Commission related to
- 30 administering the program.

- Section 45. The sum of \$34,400,000, or so much thereof 1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless 2 Carrier Reimbursement Fund to the Illinois Commerce 3 Commission for reimbursement of wireless carriers for costs 5 incurred in complying with the applicable provisions of Federal Communications Commission wireless enhanced 9-1-1 6 7 services mandates and for reimbursement of the Communications Revolving Fund for administrative costs incurred by the 8 Illinois Commerce Commission related to administering the 9 program. 10
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2005.
