SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 105/8.3

from Ch. 127, par. 144.3

Amends the State Finance Act. Provides that for fiscal years 2006 and thereafter appropriations from the Road Fund to the Department of State Police may not exceed \$45,000,000, and appropriations from the Road Fund to the Secretary of State may not exceed \$30,000,000. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY HB3781

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AN ACT concerning finance.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The State Finance Act is amended by changing
Section 8.3 as follows:

6 (30 ILCS 105/8.3) (from Ch. 127, par. 144.3)

7 Sec. 8.3. Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the 8 construction of permanent highways, be set aside and used for 9 the purpose of paying and discharging annually the principal 10 and interest on that bonded indebtedness then due and payable, 11 and for no other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund 12 after the payment of principal and interest on that bonded 13 14 indebtedness then annually due shall be used as follows:

15 first -- to pay the cost of administration of Chapters 16 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, except the cost 17 of administration of Articles I and II of Chapter 3 of that 18 Code; and

19 secondly -- for expenses of the Department of Transportation for construction, 20 reconstruction, improvement, repair, maintenance, operation, 21 and highways in accordance with 22 administration of the 23 provisions of laws relating thereto, or for any purpose related or incident to and connected therewith, including 24 25 the separation of grades of those highways with railroads 26 and with highways and including the payment of awards made by the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission under the 27 of the Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' 28 terms 29 Occupational Diseases Act for injury or death of an 30 employee of the Division of Highways in the Department of Transportation; or for the acquisition of land and the 31 erection of buildings for highway purposes, including the 32

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1 acquisition of highway right-of-way or for investigations 2 to determine the reasonably anticipated future highway needs; or for making of surveys, plans, specifications and 3 estimates for and in the construction and maintenance of 4 5 flight strips and of highways necessary to provide access 6 to military and naval reservations, to defense industries and defense-industry sites, and to the sources of raw 7 materials and for replacing existing highways and highway 8 connections shut off from general public use at military 9 and naval reservations and defense-industry sites, or for 10 11 the purchase of right-of-way, except that the State shall 12 be reimbursed in full for any expense incurred in building the flight strips; or for the operating and maintaining of 13 highway garages; or for patrolling and policing the public 14 highways and conserving the peace; or for the operating 15 16 expenses of the Department relating to the administration 17 of public transportation programs; or for any of those purposes or any other purpose that may be provided by law. 18

Appropriations for any of those purposes are payable from the Road Fund. Appropriations may also be made from the Road Fund for the administrative expenses of any State agency that are related to motor vehicles or arise from the use of motor vehicles.

Beginning with fiscal year 1980 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement;

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1. Department of Public Health;

2. Department of Transportation, only with respect to
 subsidies for one-half fare Student Transportation and
 Reduced Fare for Elderly;

34 3. Department of Central Management Services, except
 35 for expenditures incurred for group insurance premiums of
 36 appropriate personnel;

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4. Judicial Systems and Agencies.

Beginning with fiscal year 1981 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement:

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 Department of State Police, except for expenditures with respect to the Division of Operations;

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2. Department of Transportation, only with respect to Intercity Rail Subsidies and Rail Freight Services.

12 Beginning with fiscal year 1982 and thereafter, no Road 13 Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or 14 15 operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon 16 appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are 17 eligible for federal reimbursement: Department of Central Management Services, except for awards made by the Illinois 18 19 Workers' Compensation Commission under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act or Workers' Occupational Diseases 20 21 Act for injury or death of an employee of the Division of Highways in the Department of Transportation. 22

Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the following Departments or agencies of State government for administration, grants, or operations; but this limitation is not a restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement:

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1. Department of State Police, except not more than 40% of the funds appropriated for the Division of Operations;

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2. State Officers.

32 Beginning with fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, no Road 33 Fund monies shall be appropriated to any Department or agency 34 of State government for administration, grants, or operations 35 except as provided hereafter; but this limitation is not a 36 restriction upon appropriating for those purposes any Road Fund - 4 - LRB094 08277 BDD 38466 b

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monies that are eligible for federal reimbursement. It shall not be lawful to circumvent the above appropriation limitations by governmental reorganization or other methods. Appropriations shall be made from the Road Fund only in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

Money in the Road Fund shall, if and when the State of 6 Illinois incurs any bonded indebtedness for the construction of 7 permanent highways, be set aside and used for the purpose of 8 paying and discharging during each fiscal year the principal 9 10 and interest on that bonded indebtedness as it becomes due and 11 payable as provided in the Transportation Bond Act, and for no 12 other purpose. The surplus, if any, in the Road Fund after the 13 payment of principal and interest on that bonded indebtedness then annually due shall be used as follows: 14

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first -- to pay the cost of administration of Chapters 2 through 10 of the Illinois Vehicle Code; and

17 secondly -- no Road Fund monies derived from fees, license taxes relating to registration, 18 excises, or 19 operation and use of vehicles on public highways or to 20 fuels used for the propulsion of those vehicles, shall be 21 appropriated or expended other than for costs of administering the laws imposing those fees, excises, and 22 23 license taxes, statutory refunds and adjustments allowed thereunder, administrative costs of the Department of 24 but not limited to, 25 Transportation, including, the 26 operating expenses of the Department relating to the 27 administration of public transportation programs, payment 28 of debts and liabilities incurred in construction and 29 reconstruction of public highways and bridges, acquisition 30 of rights-of-way for and the cost of construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and operation of 31 32 public highways and bridges under the direction and supervision of the State, political subdivision, 33 or municipality collecting those monies, and the costs for 34 patrolling and policing the public highways (by State, 35 political subdivision, or municipality collecting that 36

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1 money) for enforcement of traffic laws. The separation of 2 grades of such highways with railroads and costs associated 3 with protection of at-grade highway and railroad crossing 4 shall also be permissible.

5 Appropriations for any of such purposes are payable from 6 the Road Fund or the Grade Crossing Protection Fund as provided 7 in Section 8 of the Motor Fuel Tax Law.

8 Except as provided in this paragraph, beginning with fiscal 9 year 1991 and through fiscal year 2002 thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police 10 for the purposes of this Section in excess of its total fiscal 11 12 year 1990 Road Fund appropriations for those purposes unless 13 otherwise provided in Section 5g of this Act. For fiscal years 2003, 2004, and 2005 only, no Road Fund monies shall be 14 15 appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section in excess of \$97,310,000. For fiscal years 2006 16 17 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Department of State Police for the purposes of this Section 18 in excess of \$45,000,000. It shall not be lawful to circumvent 19 20 this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods unless otherwise provided in 21 22 Section 5g of this Act.

In fiscal year 1994, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 1991 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes, plus \$9,800,000. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other method.

Beginning with fiscal year 1995 and thereafter, no Road Fund monies shall be appropriated to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section in excess of the total fiscal year 1994 Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for those purposes. It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on appropriations by governmental reorganization or other methods. HB3781

Beginning with fiscal year 2000, total Road Fund appropriations to the Secretary of State for the purposes of this Section shall not exceed the amounts specified for the following fiscal years:

14 It shall not be lawful to circumvent this limitation on 15 appropriations by governmental reorganization or other 16 methods.

No new program may be initiated in fiscal year 1991 and thereafter that is not consistent with the limitations imposed by this Section for fiscal year 1984 and thereafter, insofar as appropriation of Road Fund monies is concerned.

Nothing in this Section prohibits transfers from the Road Fund to the State Construction Account Fund under Section 5e of this Act; nor to the General Revenue Fund, as authorized by this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly.

The additional amounts authorized for expenditure in this Section by Public Acts 92-0600 and 93-0025 shall be repaid to the Road Fund from the General Revenue Fund in the next succeeding fiscal year that the General Revenue Fund has a positive budgetary balance, as determined by generally accepted accounting principles applicable to government.

The additional amounts authorized for expenditure by the Secretary of State and the Department of State Police in this Section by this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly shall be repaid to the Road Fund from the General Revenue Fund in the next succeeding fiscal year that the General Revenue Fund has a positive budgetary balance, as determined by HB3781 - 7 - LRB094 08277 BDD 38466 b generally accepted accounting principles applicable to government.
