

94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB4459

Introduced 1/10/2006, by Rep. Donald L. Moffitt

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 805/805-305 515 ILCS 5/20-48 new 520 ILCS 5/3.1-5 new was 20 ILCS 805/63a23

Amends the Department of Natural Resources (Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois, the Fish and Aquatic Life Code, and the Wildlife Code to allow Illinois residents who are veterans of the Vietnam War, as recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs, and that served in that conflict as an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard, or the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces to camp, fish, and hunt without paying fees for the period of time that the member served in that conflict. Requires the qualifying veteran to apply for a pass at the Department office in Springfield and to provide verification of service to the Department. Provides that any portion of a year that the active duty member served shall count as a full year. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

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1 AN ACT concerning recreation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Natural Resources

 (Conservation) Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois

 amended by changing Section 805-305 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 805/805-305) (was 20 ILCS 805/63a23)

805-305. Campsites and housing facilities. 8 Department has the power to provide facilities for overnight 9 tent and trailer camp sites and to provide suitable housing 10 facilities for student and juvenile overnight camping groups. 11 of Natural Resources 12 Department may regulate, administrative order, the fees to be charged for tent and 13 14 trailer camping units at individual park areas based upon the 15 facilities available. However, for campsites with access to showers or electricity, any Illinois resident who is age 62 or 16 17 older or has a Class 2 disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois Identification Card Act shall be charged only 18 19 one-half of the camping fee charged to the general public during the period Monday through Thursday of any week and shall 20 be charged the same camping fee as the general public on all 21 22 other days. For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this Section shall be 23 charged to any resident of Illinois who has a Class 2 24 25 disability as defined in Section 4A of the Illinois 26 Identification Card Act. For campsites without access to showers or electricity, no camping fee authorized by this 27 28 Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois who is age 29 62 or older for the use of a camp site unit during the period 30 Monday through Thursday of any week. No camping fee authorized by this Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois 31 32 who is a disabled veteran or a former prisoner of war, as

defined in Section 5 of the Department of Veterans Affairs Act. 1 2 No camping fee authorized by this Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois who is a veteran of the Vietnam War, 3 as recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs, and 4 5 that served in that conflict as an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard, or the Reserves 6 of the United States Armed Forces, if the person applies for a 7 pass at the Department office in Springfield and provides 8 verification of service in that conflict to the Department; any 9 portion of a year that the active duty member served in that 10 11 conflict shall count as a full year. No camping fee authorized 12 by this Section shall be charged to any resident of Illinois after returning from service abroad or mobilization by the 13 President of the United States as an active duty member of the 14 United States Armed Forces, the Illinois National Guard, or the 15 16 Reserves of the United States Armed Forces for the amount of 17 time that the active duty member spent in service abroad or mobilized if the person applies for a pass at the Department 18 19 office in Springfield within 2 years of returning and provides 20 verification of service or mobilization to the Department; any portion of a year that the active duty member spent in service 21 abroad or mobilized shall count as a full year. Nonresidents 22 23 shall be charged the same fees as are authorized for the general public regardless of age. The Department shall provide 24 25 by regulation for suitable proof of age, or either a valid 26 driver's license or a "Golden Age Passport" issued by the 27 federal government shall be acceptable as proof of age. The 28 Department shall further provide by regulation that notice of 29 these reduced admission fees be posted in a conspicuous place 30 and manner.

Reduced fees authorized in this Section shall not apply to any charge for utility service.

34 Section 10. The Fish and Aquatic Life Code is amended by adding Section 20-48 as follows:

- 3 (a) Any resident of Illinois who is a veteran of the

- 8 permitted by this Code without paying any fees required to
- 9 <u>obtain a fishing license for the time period prescribed by</u>

- 11 <u>verification of service to the Department at the Department's</u>
- office in Springfield.
- (b) For each year that an applicant was an active duty
- 14 member pursuant to subsection (a) of this Section, the
- 15 <u>applicant shall receive one free fishing license.</u> For the
- purposes of this determination, if the period of active duty is
- a portion of a year (for example, one year and 3 months), the
- applicant will be credited with a full year for the portion of
- 19 <u>a year served.</u>

- 21 suitable verification of service under subsection (a) of this

- 24 3.1-5 as follows:

- Sec. 3.1-5. Vietnam veterans.
- 27 <u>(a) Any resident of Illinois who is a veteran of the</u>
- 28 <u>Vietnam War</u>, as recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans'
- 29 Affairs, and that served in that conflict as an active duty

member of the United States Armed Forces, the National Guard,

- or the Reserves of the United States Armed Forces may hunt any
- of the species protected by Section 2.2 of this Code without
- 33 paying any fees required to obtain a hunting license for the
