

94TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2005 and 2006 HB4894

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 317/30

Amends the Fire Sprinkler Contractor Licensing Act. Provides that all inspections and testing of existing fire sprinkler systems and control equipment must be performed by a licensee under the Act or an individual employed by a licensee. Sets forth qualifications for individuals performing the inspection and testing duties. Exempts individuals performing inspection or testing of fire sprinkler systems on behalf of a municipality, county, or fire protection district from the requirement.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Fire Sprinkler Contractor Licensing Act is amended by changing Section 30 as follows:
- 6 (225 ILCS 317/30)
- Sec. 30. Requirements for the installation, and repair, inspection, and testing of fire protection systems.
 - (a) Equipment shall be listed by a nationally recognized testing laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. or Factory Mutual Laboratories, Inc., or shall comply with nationally accepted standards. The State Fire Marshal shall adopt by rule procedures for determining whether a laboratory is nationally recognized, taking into account the laboratory's facilities, procedures, use of nationally recognized standards, and any other criteria reasonably calculated to reach an informed determination.
 - (b) Equipment shall be installed in accordance with the applicable standards of the National Fire Protection Association and the manufacturer's specifications.
- (c) The contractor shall furnish the user with operating instructions for all equipment installed, together with a diagram of the final installation.
- (d) All fire sprinkler systems shall have a backflow 24 25 prevention device or, in a municipality with a population over 26 500,000, a double detector check assembly installed by a licensed plumber before the fire sprinkler system connection to 27 28 the water service. Connection to the backflow prevention device 29 or, in a municipality with a population over 500,000, a double 30 detector assembly shall be done in a manner consistent with the Department of Public Health's Plumbing Code. 31
- 32 (e) This licensing Act is not intended to require any

- 1 additional fire inspections at State level.
- 2 (f) All inspections and testing of existing fire sprinkler
- 3 systems and control equipment must be performed by a licensee
- 4 or an individual employed by a licensee. Any individual who
- 5 performs inspection and testing duties under this subsection
- 6 (f) must possess proof of (i) NICET Certification Level II or
- 7 <u>higher in Inspection and Testing of Water Based Systems or (ii)</u>
- 8 <u>satisfactory completion of a certified sprinkler fitter</u>
- 9 apprenticeship program. The requirements of this subsection
- 10 (f) do not apply to individuals performing inspection or
- 11 testing of fire sprinkler systems on behalf of a municipality,
- 12 <u>county</u>, or fire protection district.
