Makes appropriations for capital expenditures for the following agencies: Department of Agriculture, Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Military Affairs, Department of State Police, Department of Transportation, Capital Development Board, Illinois Commerce Commission, Environmental Protection Agency, Historic Preservation Agency, Illinois Finance Authority, Medical District Commission, Eastern Illinois University, Northeastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, University of Illinois, Illinois Community College Board, State Board of Elections, Architect of the Capitol, and Department of Central Management Services.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

6 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary are appropriated to the
8 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
9 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
10 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
11 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
12 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

13 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

14 For various projects at the State

15 Fairgrounds \$600,000

16 For various projects at the DuQuoin State

17 Fairgrounds 225,000

18 Total \$825,000

19 Total, Article 1 \$825,000

20 ARTICLE 2

21 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

22 Section 5. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port
24 Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce
25 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with
26 the Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30
27 ILCS 750/9-11.

1 Section 10. The amount of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
3 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
4 Opportunity for a grant to Argonne National Laboratory for
5 the Advanced Protein Crystallization Facility.

6 Section 15. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
7 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build
8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
9 Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Science and
10 Technology Park.

11 Section 20. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
12 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build
13 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
14 Opportunity for grants pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
15 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

16 Section 25. The amount of \$25,000,000, or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build
18 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
19 Opportunity for grant associated with the Illinois Renewable
20 Fuels Development Act.

21 Section 30. The amount of \$15,000,000, or so much
22 thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build
23 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
24 Opportunity for grants associated with the redevelopment of
25 brownfield sites.

26 Section 35. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof
27 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
28 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
29 Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Institute of

1 technology for the biomedical research complex.

2

3 Section 40. The amount of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof
 4 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
 5 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 6 Opportunity for a grant to Fermi National Accelerator
 7 Laboratory for the Illinois Accelerator Research Center.

8

9 Section 45. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
 10 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
 11 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 12 Opportunity for the Coal Demonstration Program.

13

14 Section 50. The amount of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof
 15 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Coal
 16 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 17 Opportunity for the development of other forms of energy.

18

19 Section 55. No contract shall be entered into or
 20 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from an
 21 appropriation herein made in Sections 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35
 22 40, 45 and 50 of this Article until after the purpose and
 23 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

25 ARTICLE 3

26 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

27 Section 5. The amount of \$1,129,036, or so much thereof
 28 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
 29 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
 30 made in Article 98, Section 5 of Public Act 94-0015, is
 31 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the

1 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
2 to the DuPage Airport Authority for planning, design,
3 construction and access infrastructure related to the hi-tech
4 business campus.

5 Section 10. The amount of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made in Article 98, Section 10 of Public Act 94-0015, is
9 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
10 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
11 for planning, design, construction, and all other costs
12 associated with a new Ford Technical Training Center.

13 Section 20. The amounts of \$22,000,000 and \$551,947, or
14 so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at
15 the close of business on June 30, 2006, from reappropriations
16 heretofore made in Article 98, Section 20 of Public Act 94-
17 0015, are reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to
18 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the
19 purpose of providing partial funds for planning, design,
20 engineering and testing, and construction of a low emissions
21 boiler system for Illinois high-sulfur coals.

22 Section 25. The sum of \$2,050,415, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
24 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
25 made in Article 98, Section 25 of Public Act 94-0015, is
26 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
27 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for the Coal
28 Demonstration Program.

29 Section 30. The sum of \$6,000,000, or so much thereof as
30 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made in Article 98, Section 30 of Public Act 94-0015, is
3 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for Coal
5 Development Programs.

6 Section 35. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
8 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
9 made in Article 98, Section 35 of Public Act 94-0015, is
10 reappropriated from the Coal Development Fund to the
11 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
12 pursuant to 20 ILCS 605/605-332 - Coal Revival Program.

13 Section 45. The sum of \$10,343,825, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made in Article 98, Section 45 of Public Act 94-0015, is
17 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
18 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
19 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
20 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

21 Section 50. The sum of \$3,723,761, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
23 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
24 made for such purpose in Article 98, Section 50 of Public Act
25 94-0015, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
26 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
27 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
28 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

29 Section 55. The sum of \$2,381,114, or so much thereof as
30 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made in Article 98, Section 55 of Public Act 94-0015, is
3 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
4 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
5 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
6 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

7 Section 60. The sum of \$10,442,122, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 98, Section 60 of Public Act 94-0015, is
11 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
12 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
13 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
14 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

15 Section 65. The sum of \$4,986,051, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
17 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
18 made in Article 98, Section 65 of Public Act 94-0015, is
19 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
20 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants
21 and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article 9 or
22 Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

23 Section 70. The sum of \$6,900,000, or so much thereof as
24 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
25 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
26 made in Article 98, Section 70 of Public Act 94-0015, is
27 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
28 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to
29 companies to expand or construct ethanol plants in Illinois.

30 Section 75. The sum of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
2 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
3 made in Article 98, Section 75 of Public Act 94-0015, is
4 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
5 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
6 to the Argonne National Laboratory for the Rare Isotope
7 Accelerator for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
8 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
9 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
10 purposes.

11 Section 80. The sum of \$3,188,434, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2006, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made in Article 98, Section 80 of Public Act 94-0015, is
15 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
16 Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant
17 to Argonne National Laboratory for the Nanotechnology
18 Institute for bondable infrastructure improvements. This
19 appropriated amount shall be in addition to any other
20 appropriated amounts which can be expended for these
21 purposes.

22 Section 90. The sum of \$301,713,361, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
24 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
25 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 5 of Public Act
26 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
27 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
28 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments
29 for planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
30 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
31 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
32 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act

1 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

2 Section 95. The sum of \$50,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
5 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 10 of Public
6 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
8 for the purpose of fostering economic development and
9 increased employment and the well being of the citizens of
10 Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in subsection
11 (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for
12 grants to State agencies for such purposes.

13 Section 100. The sum of \$65,712,514, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 20 of Public
17 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
19 for the development and improvement of educational,
20 scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities
21 and the expansion of health and human services, and for any
22 other purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of
23 the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies
24 for such purposes.

25 Section 105. The sum of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof
26 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
27 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
28 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 50 of Public
29 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
30 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
31 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and

1 the protection of land and for deposits into the Conservation
2 2000 Projects Fund as authorized by subsection (c) of Section
3 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State
4 agencies for such purposes.

5 Section 110. The sum of \$46,829,075, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 75 of Public
9 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
10 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
11 for grants to local governments for the acquisition,
12 financing, architectural planning, development, alteration,
13 installation, and construction of capital facilities
14 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
15 land as authorized by subsection (1) of Section 3 of the
16 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies
17 for such purposes.

18 Section 115. The sum of \$49,847,063, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2006, from an appropriation heretofore
21 made for such purpose in Article 119, Section 90 of Public
22 Act 94-0015, is reappropriated from the Fund for Illinois'
23 Future to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
24 for grants to units of government, educational facilities and
25 not-for-profit organizations for education and training,
26 infrastructure improvements and other capital projects
27 including but not limited to planning, construction,
28 reconstruction, equipment, utilities and vehicles, and all
29 costs associated with economic development programs,
30 community service programs, public health programs, public
31 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
32 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating

1 purposes.

2 Section 120. No contract shall be entered into or
3 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
4 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
5 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
6 Governor.

DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

11

GRANTS AND REIMBURSEMENTS - GENERAL OFFICE

12 Section 10. The sum of \$725,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
14 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
15 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
16 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
17 boat access areas.

18 Section 15. The sum of \$120,000, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act
20 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes
21 of the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
22 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
23 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
24 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
25 areas.

26 Section 20. To the extent federal funds including
27 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
28 \$75,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
29 appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to the

1 Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
 2 construction and development of facilities for transient,
 3 non-trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
 4 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure
 5 Grant Program.

6 Section 25. The following named sums, new
 7 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
 8 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
 9 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

10 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

11 For multiple use facilities and
 12 programs for boating purposes
 13 provided by the Department of Natural
 14 Resources, including construction
 15 and development, all costs for supplies,
 16 materials, labor, land acquisition,
 17 services, studies and all other
 18 expenses required to comply with the
 19 intent of this appropriation1,200,000

20 Payable from State Parks Fund:

21 For multiple use facilities and programs
 22 for park and trail purposes provided by
 23 the Department of Natural Resources, including
 24 construction and development, all costs
 25 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 26 acquisition, services, studies, and
 27 all other expenses required to comply with
 28 the intent of this appropriation900,000

29 Section 30. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
 30 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 31 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition
 32 and development, including grants, for the implementation of

1 the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the
 2 Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically
 3 provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.

4 Section 35. To the extent federal funds including
 5 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 6 \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 7 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the
 8 Department of Natural Resources for construction and
 9 renovation of waste reception facilities for recreational
 10 boaters, including grants for such purposes authorized under
 11 the Clean Vessel Act.

12 Section 40. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
 13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish
 14 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for wildlife
 15 conservation and restoration plans and programs from federal
 16 and/or state funds provided for such purposes.

17
 18 Section 45. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 19 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 20 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 21 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 22 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 23 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 24 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 25 refunds and the purposes stated:

26 Payable from Forest Reserve Fund:

27 For U.S. Forest Service Program500,000

28
 29 Section 50. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
 30 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Plugging and
 31 Restoration Fund to the Department of Natural Resources,
 32 Office of Mines and Minerals for the Landowner Grant Program

1 authorized under the Oil and Gas Act, as amended by Public
2 Act 90-0260.

3
4 Section 55. The sum of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
6 Natural Resources from the Abandoned Mined Lands Set Aside
7 Fund for grants and contracts to conduct research, planning
8 and construction to eliminate hazards created by abandoned
9 mines and any other expenses necessary for emergency
10 response.

11
12 Section 60. The sum of \$110,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
14 Natural Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the
15 conservation of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the
16 provisions of Section 5/1.32 of the "Wildlife Code", as now
17 or hereafter amended.

18
19 Section 65. The following named sums, new
20 appropriations, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
21 respectively, for the objects and purposes hereinafter named,
22 are appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources:

23 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:
24 For the acquisition, preservation and
25 stewardship of natural areas, including habitats
26 for endangered and threatened species, high
27 quality natural communities, wetlands
28 and other areas with unique or unusual
29 natural heritage qualities6,000,000
30

31 Section 70. The sum of \$22,000,000, or so much thereof
32 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Open Space
33 Lands Acquisition and Development Fund to the Department of
34 Natural Resources for expenses connected with and to make

1 grants to local governments and to distressed communities as
2 provided in the "Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development
3 Act".

4
5 Section 75. The sum of \$550,000, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant
7 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
8 conservation of pheasants in accordance with the provisions
9 of Section 5/1.31 of the "Wildlife Code", as now or hereafter
10 amended.

11

12 FOR ILLINOIS HABITAT FUND PROGRAM

13

14 Section 80. The sum of \$1,150,000, or so much thereof as
15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
16 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
17 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
18 accordance with the provisions of the "Habitat Endowment
19 Act", as now or hereafter amended.

20

21 Section 85. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
23 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
24 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
25 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor
26 sports in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of
27 Sportsmen Series license plates.

28

29 Section 90. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
30 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
31 Natural Resources for expenditure by the Office of Water
32 Resources from the Flood Control Land Lease Fund for
33 disbursement of monies received pursuant to Act of Congress
34 dated September 3, 1954 (68 Statutes 1266, same as appears in

1 Section 701c-3, Title 33, United States Code Annotated),
 2 provided such disbursement shall be in compliance with 15
 3 ILCS 515/1 Illinois Compiled Statutes.

4
 5 Section 95. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 6 as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 7 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 8 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 9 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 10 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 11 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 12 refunds and the purposes stated:

13 Payable from Land and Water Recreation Fund:

14 For Outdoor Recreation Programs\$6,200,000

15
 16 Section 100. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
 17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off Highway
 18 Vehicle Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
 19 for grants to units of local governments, not-for-profit
 20 organizations, and other groups to operate, maintain and
 21 acquire land for off-highway vehicle trails and parks as
 22 provided for in the Recreational Trails of Illinois Act,
 23 including administration, enforcement, planning and
 24 implementation of this Act.

25
 26 Section 110. The following named sums, or so much
 27 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, herein made either
 28 independently or in cooperation with the Federal Government
 29 or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or
 30 political subdivision of the State, or with any public or
 31 private corporation, organization, or individual, are
 32 appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources for
 33 refunds and the purposes stated:

34 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

1 Protection Assistance Fund:
 2 For Rural Community Fire Protection
 3 Programs325,000
 4

5 Section 115. The sum of \$80,000, or so much thereof as
 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 7 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 8 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 9 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 10 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and
 11 areas for the use of snowmobiles.
 12

13 Section 120. The sum of \$625,000, or so much thereof as
 14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 15 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 16 the payment of grants to timber growers for implementation of
 17 acceptable forestry management practices as provided in the
 18 "Illinois Forestry Development Act" as now or hereafter
 19 amended.
 20

21 Section 125. To the extent Federal Funds including
 22 reimbursements are made available for such purposes, the sum
 23 of \$300,000, is appropriated from the Illinois Forestry
 24 Development Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 25 Forest Stewardship Technical Assistance.
 26

27 Section 130. The sum of \$160,000, or so much thereof as
 28 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
 29 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources
 30 for the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
