HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois and the United States of 2 3 America were founded by immigrants who traveled from around the world to seek a better life; and 4 WHEREAS, Immigrants have made enormous contributions to 5 our nation's economic, cultural, and political life, and these 6 7 contributions have been recognized and honored throughout our 8 history and across the political spectrum; and 9 WHEREAS, Our nation's immigration system should uphold our basic values of family, economic opportunity, and fairness; and 10 WHEREAS, The U.S. immigration system is in disarray and in 11 12 need of comprehensive reform: immigrants who are eager to 13 rejoin family members or willing to work in the U.S. are unable to immigrate under the current system or face long backlogs; 14 15 and WHEREAS, The mismatch between our nation's immigration 16 laws and our economic needs and family values has led to deaths 17 on the border, a large underground market in false documents, 18 and an undocumented population of eleven million immigrants, 19 including half a million in Illinois, and widespread disregard 20 21 for our immigration laws; and 22 WHEREAS, President Bush and leaders of both political 23 parties in both chambers of Congress recognize the need for 24 realistic, common-sense, humane solutions for our immigration 25 problems; and WHEREAS, U.S. Senators John McCain, Republican of Arizona, 26 27 and Edward Kennedy, Democrat of Massachusetts, and U.S.

Representatives Jim Kolbe and Jeff Flake, Republicans from

Arizona, and Luis Gutierrez, Democrat from Illinois, have

- 1 proposed legislation offering such solutions; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Their proposed legislation includes cutting
- through our current immigration backlogs to reunite families 3
- sooner; a guestworker program, similar to that proposed by 4
- 5 President Bush, that would provide a safe and orderly way for
- willing immigrant workers to fill essential jobs in our 6
- 7 economy; realistic enforcement strategies to ensure the
- 8 security of our nation's borders; and a means for hardworking
- 9 immigrants to earn legal status, upon paying a penalty for
- 10 their time in the U.S. out of status, and to eventually become
- 11 U.S. citizens; and
- 12 WHEREAS, By restoring order to our immigration system, such
- 13 reforms will make our nation more secure as well as meet our
- 14 labor needs and uphold our basic values as a nation; and
- WHEREAS, In a recent bipartisan poll, 77% of respondents 15
- supported such comprehensive reform to our immigration system; 16
- 17 and
- WHEREAS, Comprehensive immigration reform is supported by 18
- business, organized labor, faith communities, and other 19
- leaders and sectors in our country; therefore, be it 20
- 21 ΒY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES RESOLVED, ΟF THE
- NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE 22
- 23 SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we do hereby wholeheartedly
- 24 support comprehensive immigration reform and the
- 25 McCain-Kennedy legislation, and we urge the United States
- 26 Congress to enact this legislation; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be
- presented to the President pro-tem of the U.S. Senate, the 28
- Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, and to each 29
- 30 member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.
