HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The adult female population in prisons in the 2 3 State of Illinois was 2,806 in 2004, a 154 percent increase over the past ten years; and 4 WHEREAS, Of this population, less than 30 percent of these 5 female prisoners were incarcerated for committing violent crimes; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Cook County Jail currently houses over 1,300 women 9 on any given day and, of this population, approximately 90 percent are charged with non-violent crimes; and 10 11 WHEREAS, In prisons in the State of Illinois, 82 percent of 12 women are mothers and almost 50 percent have children under 13 five years of age; and 14 WHEREAS, Each year at least 25,000 children in the State of 15 Illinois are impacted by maternal incarceration; and WHEREAS, In the State of Illinois, at least 60,000 minor 16 17 children will have their mothers spend time in a State prison while they are children; and 18 19 WHEREAS, An estimated 80 percent of all incarcerated women 20 in the State of Illinois suffer from substance abuse problems; 21 the State of Illinois can place fewer than 20 percent of all incarcerated women into its substance abuse programs; and 22 23 WHEREAS, It is a known fact that drug addiction causes 24 crime, destroys the family structure, creates havoc in neighborhoods, and leaves paths of destruction in its wake; 25 individuals convicted of crimes who have not received 26 meaningful treatment while incarcerated continue to commit 27 28 crimes; and

1 WHEREAS, In the United States, by mid-year of 2003, the 2 number of adult female inmates rose 6.3 percent over the 3 previous year; and

WHEREAS, Community-based alternatives to incarceration for women convicted of non-violent offenses would allow children to stay with their mothers while their mothers receive appropriate treatment; with the appropriate treatment, the mothers would be less likely to commit additional offenses and would be able to re-enter society as tax-paying citizens; in addition, their children would be less likely to become the next generation of incarcerated individuals; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize May 6, 2005, as Mothers in Prison, Children in Crisis Day in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Chicago Legal Advocacy for Incarcerated Mothers (CLAIM).
