HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, An estimated 35,000 Illinoisans are living with 3 HIV/AIDS; and

4 WHEREAS, The federal Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS 5 Resources Emergency (CARE) Act is critical to meeting the 6 healthcare and support service needs of Illinoisans living with 7 HIV who are low-income and/or uninsured; and

8 WHEREAS, Illinois communities rely on more than 9 \$60,000,000 in Ryan White CARE Act funding each year to provide an array of HIV-related healthcare, dental, mental health, 10 substance abuse treatment, case management, 11 medication legal assistance, 12 reimbursement, housing, nutrition 13 counseling, and other essential services; and

14 WHEREAS, The most recent CARE Act authorization law expired 15 on September 30, 2005, and Congress will soon consider new 16 legislation to shape the future direction of CARE Act programs; 17 and

18 WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services 19 (HHS) released a reauthorization proposal in July of 2005, 20 that, if enacted, would severely reduce CARE Act funding for 21 Illinois; and

22 WHEREAS, One of the provisions in the proposal requires 23 funding formulas beginning in FY 2007 to include the number of 24 HIV cases, but the U.S. government has refused to accept data 25 from Illinois because it has collected HIV case reports by 26 code, an option given to states in 1999; and

27 WHEREAS, On January 1, 2006, Illinois will begin collecting 28 and reporting cases of HIV by name, the preferred method for 29 the federal government, but will need additional time for the HR0686 -2- LRB094 14913 RSP 49967 r
reporting system to mature so that all cases of HIV reported in
Illinois can be counted toward funding formula allocations; and

3 WHEREAS, Other provisions recommended by HHS would result 4 in dramatic funding reductions for AIDS-related services to 5 suburban, rural, and urban communities across Illinois, and 6 reduce AIDS-related healthcare and essential services; 7 therefore, be it

8 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES RESOLVED, ΒY OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that 9 10 we urge the Congress of the United States to enact legislation retaining the current "hold-harmless" provisions of the 2000 11 12 Ryan White CARE Act reauthorization, which protects jurisdictions from large, destabilizing reductions in funding; 13 14 and be it further

15 RESOLVED, That we urge Congress to explore the use of 16 scientifically-derived estimates of the number of people 17 living with HIV/AIDS in U.S. jurisdictions for funding 18 distribution purposes until HIV surveillance systems are 19 sufficiently accurate and complete across the nation to fairly 20 base funding decisions; and be it further

21 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be 22 delivered to the President Pro Tempore of the U.S. Senate, the 23 Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives, the Secretary of 24 the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Governor Rod 25 Blagojevich, and each member of the Illinois congressional 26 delegation.
