SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Force Fed Birds Act. Prohibits force feeding birds and selling products that are the result of force feeding birds. Violation is a petty offense with a fine of \$1,000. Each day is a separate offense.

AN ACT concerning animals.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Force5 Fed Birds Act.

6 Section 5. Prohibition; penalties.

7 (a) In this Section:

8 (1) A "bird" includes, but is not limited to, a duck 9 or goose.

10 (2) "Force feeding a bird" means a process that causes 11 the bird to consume more food than a typical bird of the 12 same species would consume voluntarily. Force feeding 13 methods include, but are not limited to, delivering feed 14 through a tube or other device inserted into the bird's 15 esophagus.

(b) A person may not force feed a bird for the purpose of enlarging the bird's liver beyond normal size or hire another person to do so.

19 (c) A product may not be sold in Illinois if it is the 20 result of force feeding a bird for the purpose of enlarging the 21 bird's liver beyond normal size.

(d) A person who knowingly violates this Section is guilty
of a petty offense and shall be fined \$1,000. Each day that a
violation occurs is a separate offense.
