AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 508 1 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend Senate Bill 508 by replacing 3 everything after the enacting clause with the following: "Section 5. The Illinois Highway Code is amended by adding 4 5 Section 4-220 as follows: (605 ILCS 5/4-220 new)6 7 Sec. 4-220. Accommodation of all roadway users. (a) The General Assembly finds that it is the public policy 8 of this State that Department of Transportation projects must 9 adequately meet the transportation needs of all roadway users, 10 including those who travel along or across State roadways by 11 motor vehicle, foot, bicycle, or wheelchair. 12 (b) To support this policy and to meet the intent of 13 federal transportation law, the Department shall adopt the 14 Federal Highway Administration's "Accommodating Bicycle and 15 16 Pedestrian Travel" policy in a manner consistent with Illinois law. The federal policy requires the routine inclusion of 17 bicycling and walking facilities in all projects except where 18 there is an absence of need, where cost limits are exceeded, 19 where bicyclists and pedestrians are prohibited, or where other 20 21 exceptional circumstances exist. This policy does not apply to pavement resurfacing projects 22 that are in progress on January 1, 2006 and that do not widen 23 the existing roadway and do not provide stabilized shoulders, 24

- This policy shall become effective July 1, 2006 for 4
- 5 planning and training purposes only. For construction
- projects, this policy shall become effective July 1, 2007. 6
- 7 (c) The Department shall file with the Governor and the
- General Assembly, no later than March 1, 2007, a report 8
- containing an evaluation of existing bicycle and pedestrian 9
- accommodation in State roadway projects and a comparison of 10
- these projects with federal guidelines and the best practices 11
- of other states. 12
- (d) The Department shall, no later than March 1, 2007, 13
- submit to the Governor and the General Assembly a transition 14
- 15 plan for:
- (1) specific policy and implementation changes 16
- identified in the report and; 17
- (2) training on bicycle and pedestrian accommodation 18
- all Department staff and contractors involved in 19
- 20 roadway planning and design.
- 21 (e) The Department shall report to the Governor and the
- General Assembly, on March 1, 2007 and on March 1 of every 22
- succeeding odd-numbered year, on the status of all planning and 23
- construction projects that have included pedestrian, 24
- 25 wheelchair, and bicycle components. This reporting requirement
- 26 may be consolidated with other Department reporting
- requirements to Governor and the General Assembly, if the 27
- information required is distinctly available within the 28
- 29 reports.".
