## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by changing Sections 3-103, 3-125, and 3-145 as follows:

- Sec. 3-103. Municipality. "Municipality": (1) Any city, 7 village or incorporated town of 5,000 or more but less than 8 500,000 inhabitants, as determined from the United States 9 Government statistics or a census taken at any time by the 10 city, village or incorporated town, and (2) any city, village 11 or incorporated town of less than 5,000 inhabitants which, by 12 referendum held under subsection (a) of Section 3-145 adopts 13 this Article, and (3) any city, village, or incorporated town 14 15 of less than 5,000 inhabitants that is located within a county that is subject to the limitations of the Property Tax 16 Extension Limitation Law and that, in accordance with 17 subsection (b) of Section 3-145, adopts this Article by 18
- 19 resolution or ordinance.

Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of Section 3-145, the The city council or the 23 24 board of trustees of the municipality shall annually levy a tax 25 upon all the taxable property of the municipality at the rate on the dollar which will produce an amount which, when added to 26 27 the deductions from the salaries or wages of police officers, and revenues available from other sources, will equal a sum 28 29 sufficient to meet the annual requirements of the police pension fund. The annual requirements to be provided by such 30 tax levy are equal to (1) the normal cost of the pension fund 31
