Amends the Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail Technology Act of 1985. Requires the licensure of barber clinic teachers. Provides the qualifications for a barber clinic teacher license. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Barber, Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Nail 5 Technology Act of 1985 is amended by changing Sections 1-7 and 6 2-4 as follows:

7 (225 ILCS 410/1-7) (from Ch. 111, par. 1701-7)

9 Sec. 1-7. Licensure required; renewal.

(a) It is unlawful for any person to practice, or to hold 10 himself or herself out to be a cosmetologist, esthetician, nail 11 technician, or barber without a license as a cosmetologist, 12 esthetician, nail technician, or barber issued 13 by the 14 Department of Professional Regulation pursuant to the provisions of this Act and of the Civil Administrative Code of 15 Illinois. It is also unlawful for 16 any person, firm, 17 partnership, or corporation to own, operate, or conduct a 18 cosmetology, esthetics, nail technology, or barber school 19 without a license issued by the Department or to own or operate 20 a cosmetology, esthetics, or nail technology salon or barber shop without a certificate of registration issued by the 21 22 Department. It is further unlawful for any person to teach in 23 any cosmetology, esthetics, nail technology, or barber college or school approved by the Department or hold himself or herself 24 25 out as a cosmetology, esthetics, nail technology, or barber 26 teacher without a license as a teacher, issued by the Department or as a <u>barber clinic teacher or</u> cosmetology, 27 28 esthetics, or nail technology clinic teacher without a license 29 as a clinic teacher issued by the Department.

30 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, a 31 person licensed as a cosmetologist may hold himself or herself 32 out as an esthetician and may engage in the practice of - 2 - LRB094 18786 RAS 54191 b

1 esthetics, as defined in this Act, without being licensed as an 2 esthetician. A person licensed as a cosmetology teacher may teach esthetics or hold himself or herself out as an esthetics 3 teacher without being licensed as an esthetics teacher. A 4 5 person licensed as a cosmetologist may hold himself or herself 6 out as a nail technician and may engage in the practice of nail technology, as defined in this Act, without being licensed as a 7 nail technician. A person licensed as a cosmetology teacher may 8 teach nail technology and hold himself or herself out as a nail 9 10 technology teacher without being licensed as a nail technology 11 teacher.

(c) A person licensed as a barber teacher may hold himself 12 13 or herself out as a barber and may practice barbering without a license as a barber. A person licensed as a cosmetology teacher 14 may hold himself or herself out as a 15 cosmetologist, esthetician, 16 and nail technologist and may practice 17 cosmetology, esthetics, and nail technology without a license as a cosmetologist, esthetician, or nail technologist. A person 18 19 licensed as an esthetics teacher may hold himself or herself 20 out as an esthetician without being licensed as an esthetician and may practice esthetics. A person licensed as a nail 21 technician teacher may practice nail technology and may hold 22 23 himself or herself out as a nail technologist without being licensed as a nail technologist. 24

25 (d) The holder of a license issued under this Act may renew 26 that license during the month preceding the expiration date of 27 the license by paying the required fee.

Sec. 2-4. Licensure as a barber teacher; qualifications.

32 (1) A person is qualified to receive a license as a barber 33 teacher if that person files an application on forms provided 34 by the Department, pays the required fee, and:

a. Is at least 18 years of age;

1 b. Has graduated from high school or its equivalent; 2 c. Has a current license as a barber; d. Has graduated from a barber school approved by the 3 Department having either: 4 (1) completed a total of 500 hours in barber 5 teacher training extending over a period of not less 6 than 3 months nor more than 2 years and has had 3 years 7 of practical experience as a licensed barber; or 8 9 (2) completed a total of 1,000 hours of barber teacher training extending over a period of not less 10 11 than 6 months nor more than 2 years; and 12 e. Has passed an examination authorized by the Department to determine fitness to receive a license as a 13 barber teacher; and 14 15 f. Has met any other requirements set forth in this 16 Act. An applicant who is issued a license as a Barber 17 Teacher is not required to maintain a barber license in 18 19 order to practice barbering as defined in this Act. 20 (2) A person is qualified to receive a license as a barber clinic teacher if he or she has applied in writing on forms 21 provided by the Department, has paid the required fees, and: 22 23 (A) is at least 18 years of age; (B) has graduated from high school or its equivalent; 24 25 (C) has a current license as a barber; and (D) has either: (i) completed a program of 500 hours of 26 27 teacher training in a licensed barber school and had 2 years of practical experience as a licensed barber within 5 28 years preceding the examination; or (ii) completed a 29 program of 1,000 hours of teacher training in a licensed 30 31 barber school.
