1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the State

 Services Assurance Act.
- Section 5. Legislative intent and policy. The General
 Assembly finds that State government delivers a myriad of
 services that are necessary for the health, welfare, safety,
 and quality of life of all Illinois residents.
 - It is the intent of the General Assembly to monitor staffing levels in all executive branch agencies under the authority of the Governor and to develop a system to ensure the effective delivery of vital State services. To that end, this Act establishes minimum staffing standards in State agencies where lives and public safety are at greatest risk: in facilities operated by the Departments of Corrections and Human Services, and in Department of Human Services Family and Community Resource Centers.
- 19 Section 10. Staffing ratios.
- 20 (a) The collective average staffing ratio of correctional 21 centers operated by the Department of Corrections shall be at 22 or above 0.295 staff per inmate.
- 23 (b) The collective average staffing ratio of mental health 24 centers operated by the Department of Human Services shall be 25 at or above 2.5 staff per patient.
- (c) The collective average staffing ratio of developmental centers operated by the Department of Human Services shall be at or above 1.9 staff per resident.
 - (d) The collective average caseload of employees in Family and Community Resource Centers operated by the Department of Human Services shall be at or below 288 cases.

Section 15. Departmental task forces. The Department of Children and Family Services shall convene a Caseload Standards Task Force. The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall convene a Workload Standards Task Force. The Department of Juvenile Justice shall convene a Staffing Ratio Standards Task Force. Task Force shall include an equal number representatives of the respective Department, labor unions representing Department employees, and advocates. Department of Children and Family Services Caseload Standards Task Force shall establish reasonable caseload standards for effective child welfare service delivery. The Department of Veterans' Affairs Workload Standards Task Force establish reasonable workload standards at facilities operated by the Department. The Department of Juvenile Justice Staffing Ratio Standards Task Force shall establish reasonable staffing ratios at facilities operated by the Department. The work of each Task Force shall be completed on or before January 1, 2007. Each Department shall develop rules implementing the caseload or workload standards.

Section 20. Staffing audit. The Auditor General shall conduct performance audits of executive branch agencies listed in Section 5-15 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois to determine 5-year trends in staffing levels for direct line service programs. The audits shall analyze reported staffing levels by agency, division, program, and facility. The audits shall determine whether agencies have identified key outcome indicators for each major direct line service program including the amount, variety, and quality of programs and services delivered. The audits shall determine whether the agencies' indicators accurately reflect agency performance and are measurable consistently over time. The audits shall determine if the agencies have assessed whether staffing changes have agency performance. The audits shall impacted include recommendations where appropriate. A minimum of 6 such audits

- shall be conducted annually, beginning in fiscal year 2007.
- Section 25. Annual reports. Each executive branch agency 2 3 under the authority of the Governor shall prepare an annual 4 report on staffing levels for the committees of the House of Representatives and the Senate that conduct hearings on its 5 annual budget appropriation. The report shall include at a 6 7 minimum 5 years of actual and estimated staffing levels by 8 division, program, and facility, staffing ratios appropriate, and updated reports on the key outcome measures 9 10 identified in the audits required in Section 20. The reports 11 shall be conveyed to the appropriate committees no later than 6 months after the end of each fiscal year. 12
- Section 97. Severability. The provisions of this Act are severable under Section 1.31 of the Statute on Statutes.
- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
