Section 20. The sum of \$7,000,000, or so much thereof as 24 25 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for 26 disbursing funds collected for the Single State Insurance 27 28 Registration Program to be distributed to: (1) participating states, provided that no distributions exceed funds made 29 available from registration collections; (2) for refunds for 30 overpayments; and (3) for administrative expenses. 31

32 Section 22. The sum of \$600,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Transportation 2 Regulatory Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission for 3 railroad crossing improvement initiatives.

4 Section 25. The sum of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof as 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Digital Divide 6 Elimination Infrastructure Fund to the Illinois Commerce 7 Commission for grants and awards for the construction of 8 high-speed data transmission facilities.

9 Section 30. The sum of \$74,000, or so much thereof as 10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Underground 11 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois 12 Commerce Commission for a grant to the Statewide One-call 13 Notice System, as required in the Illinois Underground 14 Utility Facilities Damage Prevention Act.

15 The sum of \$1,000, or so much thereof as may be 16 necessary, is appropriated from the Underground Utility 17 Facilities Damage Prevention Fund to the Illinois Commerce 18 Commission for refunds.

The sum of \$42,900,000, or so much thereof Section 35. 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless 20 as Service Emergency Fund to the Illinois Commerce Commission 21 22 for grants to emergency telephone system boards, qualified 23 government entities, or the Department of State Police for 24 desiqn, implementation, operation, maintenance, the or upgrade of wireless 9-1-1 or E9-1-1 emergency services and 25 public safety answering points and for reimbursement of the 26 for administrative costs Communications Revolving Fund 27 incurred by the Illinois Commerce Commission related to 28 administering the program. 29

as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wireless 1 Carrier Reimbursement Fund to the Illinois Commerce 2 Commission for reimbursement of wireless carriers for costs 3 4 incurred in complying with the applicable provisions of Federal Communications Commission wireless enhanced 9-1-1 5 services mandates and for reimbursement of the Communications 6 7 Revolving Fund for administrative costs incurred by the Illinois Commerce Commission related to administering the 8 9 program.
