6	disaster relief appropriation in order to provide such
7	services or to reimburse local governmental bodies furnishing
8	such services. Such appropriation may be used for payment of
9	the Illinois National Guard when called to active duty in
10	case of disaster, and for the emergency purchase or renting
11	of equipment and commodities. Such appropriation shall be
12	used for emergency services and relief to the disaster area
13	as a whole and shall not be used to provide private relief to
14	persons sustaining property damages or personal injury as a
15	result of a disaster.

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Section 45. The sum of \$1,166,900, or so much thereof as 1 2 necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 3 licensing facilities where radioactive uranium thorium mill tailings are generated or located, and related 5 costs for regulating the decontamination and decommissioning 6 7 of such facilities and for identification, decontamination and environmental monitoring of unlicensed properties 8 contaminated with such radioactive mill tailings. 9

10 Section 50. The sum of \$561,000, or so much thereof as is appropriated from 11 necessary, the Radiation Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency 12 for the purpose of funding costs related to environmental 13 cleanup of the Ottawa Radiation Areas Superfund Project under 14 cooperative agreements with the Federal Government. 15

Section 55. The sum of \$150,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Radiation Protection Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for recovery and remediation of radioactive materials and contaminated facilities or properties when such expenses cannot be paid by a responsible person or an available surety.

Section 60. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Nuclear Safety Emergency Preparedness Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for related training and travel expenses and to reimburse the Illinois State Police and the Illinois Commerce Commission for costs incurred for activities related to inspecting and escorting shipments of spent nuclear fuel, high-level radioactive waste, and transuranic waste in Illinois as provided under the rules of the Agency.

- 1 Section 65. The sum of \$180,000, or so much thereof as
- 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sheffield Agreed
- 3 Order Fund to the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for
- 4 the care, maintenance, monitoring, testing, remediation and
- 5 insurance of the low-level radioactive waste disposal site
- 6 near Sheffield, Illinois.
- 7 Section 70. The sum of \$686,600, or so much thereof as
- 8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Low-Level
- 9 Radioactive Waste Facility Development and Operation Fund to
- 10 the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for use in
- 11 accordance with Section 14(a) of the Illinois Low-Level
- 12 Radioactive Waste Management Act for costs related to
- establishing a low-level radioactive waste disposal facility.
- 14 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1,
- 15 2006.
