SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 2 WHEREAS, Telecommunications technology is advancing at a

- cancelling their landline telephone service and using only 5
- wireless telecommunications service; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, Residential customers are also embracing new
- 8 telecommunications services technology that is offered over
- 9 the Internet and through cable television subscriptions; and
- of 10 WHEREAS, The use these new and emerging
- 11 telecommunications services technologies could potentially
- 12 affect 911-type emergency telecommunications services and the
- ability of emergency personnel to reach residents that are in 13
- danger; therefore, be it 14
- BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL 15 RESOLVED,
- ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 16
- CONCURRING HEREIN, that there is created the Emergency Services 17
- 18 Telecommunications Task Force, consisting of 24 members
- appointed as follows: 2 members appointed one each by the 19
- Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of 20
- the Senate, both of whom shall serve as co-chairs; 2 members 21
- 22 appointed one each by the House Minority Leader and the Senate
- 23 Minority Leader; 2 members appointed by the Governor; the
- 24 Director of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency, or his or
- 25 her designee; the Executive Director of the Illinois Commerce
- 26 Commission, or his or her designee; the Director of State
- Police, or his or her designee; and 15 members appointed by the

co-chairs that are representatives of the telecommunications

- 29 industry, law enforcement agencies, units of local government,
- 30 and consumer groups, but that are not members of the General
- Assembly. All members shall serve without compensation but 31

- shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses
- from funds appropriated for that purpose; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study existing 911-type emergency telecommunications services as they relate to new and
- 5 emerging telecommunications technologies; and be it further

6 RESOLVED, That on or before January 1, 2006, the Task Force 7 shall report to the General Assembly concerning its 8 recommendations regarding the application of emergency telecommunications services to new and emerging 9 telecommunications technology, including, but not limited to, 10 wireless telecommunications, voice over Internet protocol 11 (VOIP), and telephone service provided through cable 12 13 television subscriptions.
