1 SENATE RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, The National Campaign to Stop Red Light Running
 has assembled a team of leaders from the fields of law
 enforcement, transportation engineering, healthcare and
 emergency medicine, and traffic safety to tackle this crucial
 safety issue; and
- WHEREAS, In 2002, as many as 207,000 crashes, 178,000, injuries, and 921 fatalities in the United States were attributed to red light running; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In many cities, the yellow light has come to 11 symbolize "hurry up" instead of "slow down"; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL
 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Illinois
 Department of Transportation and local communities to program
 their traffic signals at high-accident locations to add an
 additional 2 seconds of red light time before the signal
 changes to green, allowing intersections to clear before cross
 traffic commences; and be it further
