WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the State of Illinois learned with sadness of the death of Roger Allen Anderson of Burr Ridge, formerly of Hinsdale, on Tuesday, April 26, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Anderson was born on May 5, 1919, in Chicago;
he attended Morgan Park High School and received his bachelor's
degree in mechanical engineering from Purdue University in

10 WHEREAS, After being a supervisor at Container Corp. of
11 America, he was a civilian with the Ordinance Department of the
12 U.S. Government in Springfield, Massachusetts; he joined the
13 U.S. Naval Reserves, becoming a lieutenant, and was stationed
14 in communications in Washington; and

15 WHEREAS, After World War II, he returned to Chicago and 16 joined Teninga & Co., a South Side real estate firm; he was 17 recalled to the U.S. Navy in Washington during the Korean War 18 and was discharged in 1952; and

WHEREAS, In Chicago, he established the construct firm of Bellevue Builders; he settled with his family in Hinsdale in 1954 and bought property as well as established the homes in Ridgewood and Western Springs; he built homes, apartments, condominiums, and commercial properties in other western suburbs; and

WHEREAS, In 1964, he bought Timber Trails Country Club, originally for development, but he operated the course until 2004; he was invited to become a founding member of Edgewood Bank in Countryside's board of directors; he eventually became bank's chairman of the board; and

WHEREAS, Active at Union Church of Hinsdale, Mr. Anderson taught high school and adult classes and served on many boards and committees; he was a member and president of the Hinsdale Golf Club and Great Books Foundation; he sang in the Jolly Boys singing group and attended the Hinsdale Social Studies Circle; he was one of the three founders of Washington Square retirement home in Hinsdale and served on the Hinsdale

Community Service's board; he was associated with the Community

9 Renewal Society and with Bethlehem Center, which promotes

racial justice and social welfare in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Anderson was a strong supporter of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, where he was a governing member for several decades, as well as the Lyric Opera of Chicago and the Art Institute of Chicago; he and his wife traveled extensively all over the world; they were among the first to visit China when it reopened to tourists; they visited Ireland frequently as well as Lake Geneva, Wisconsin, and Douglas and Lakeside, Michigan; and

WHEREAS, The passing of Roger Allen Anderson has been deeply felt by many, especially his wife of 63 years, Ruth; his children, Leigh (Clint) Rappole, Geoffrey, and Ross; his grandchildren, Clinton M. and Britta Rappole, and Kristin (Michael) Green; his two great-grandchildren; his three sisters; his nine sisters-in-law and brothers-in-law; and his many nieces and nephews; therefore, be it
