WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the State of Illinois learned with regret of the death of Lester Brownstein of Morton Grove on Monday, December 5, 2005; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brownstein was born on March 27, 1921, in Chicago, where he attended Stewart Grammar School and Senn High School; and

WHEREAS, He valiantly served his country as a member of the U.S. Army during World War II; he served 35 months in the Asian Pacific Theater and earned a Bronze Star; he was a member of Morton Grove American Legion Post 134 and Disabled American Veterans Federal Chapter 42; and

WHEREAS, He had been a Niles Township Trustee since his appointment in 1999; he also served on Morton Grove's Traffic Safety Commission and was chairman of the Morton Grove Caucus Party; as a trustee, he looked out for Morton Grove, ensuring the village and its residents received the assistance they needed; he was consistently concerned with doing the right thing and was known for his love of helping people; and

WHEREAS, He was a past president of the Elephant Club of Niles Township, and he was active with the Morton Grove Lions Club and the Morton Grove Chapter of B'nai B'rith; he was former Midwest director for special events with the City of Hope and a member of the Goland-Orenstein-Sherman Memorial Chapter of the Leukemia Research Foundation, Inc.; he was a life member of the Illinois Police Association, a member of St. Jude's Police Branch, and was a member of the American Law Enforcement Association; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brownstein was the husband of the late Marjorie and the late Hollis R.; the father of Steven Louis
