Amends the Illinois Lottery Law. Requires the Department of Revenue to offer a special instant scratch-off game with the title of "Quality of Life", to commence on July 1, 2007 and to be discontinued on December 31, 2012. Provides that the net revenue from the game shall be deposited into the Quality of Life Endowment Fund for appropriation by the General Assembly solely to the Department of Public Health, in consultation with the Quality of Life Board, for the purpose of HIV/AIDS-prevention education and for making grants to public or private entities in Illinois for the purpose of funding organizations that serve the highest at-risk categories for contracting HIV or developing AIDS. Amends the Department of Public Health Powers and Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois to create the Quality of Life Board as an advisory board within the Department of Public Health. Amends the State Finance Act to create the Quality of Life Endowment Fund. Sets forth procedures for the appointment of Board members and for the operation of the Board. Effective immediately.

FISCAL NOTE ACT MAY APPLY

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Lottery Law is amended by changing
- 5 Sections 2 and 20 and by adding Section 21.7 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 1605/2) (from Ch. 120, par. 1152)
- 7 Sec. 2. This Act is enacted to implement and establish
- 8 within the State a lottery to be operated by the State, the
- 9 entire net proceeds of which are to be used for the support of
- 10 the State's Common School Fund, except as provided in Sections
- 11 21.2, and 21.5, and 21.6, and 21.7.

- 15 Sec. 20. State Lottery Fund.
- 16 (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund
- 17 to be known as the "State Lottery Fund". Such fund shall
- 18 consist of all revenues received from (1) the sale of lottery
- 19 tickets or shares, (net of commissions, fees representing those
- 20 expenses that are directly proportionate to the sale of tickets
- 21 or shares at the agent location, and prizes of less than \$600
- 22 which have been validly paid at the agent level), (2)

- 1 application fees, and (3) all other sources including moneys
- 2 credited or transferred thereto from any other fund or source
- 3 pursuant to law. Interest earnings of the State Lottery Fund
- 4 shall be credited to the Common School Fund.
- 5 (b) The receipt and distribution of moneys under Section
- 6 21.5 of this Act shall be in accordance with Section 21.5.
- 7 (c) (b) The receipt and distribution of moneys under
- 8 Section 21.6 of this Act shall be in accordance with Section

- Sec. 21.7. Quality of Life scratch-off game.
- 16 (a) The Department shall offer a special instant
- 17 scratch-off game with the title of "Quality of Life". The game
- shall commence on July 1, 2007 or as soon thereafter, in the
- 19 discretion of the Director, as is reasonably practical, and
- shall be discontinued on December 31, 2012. The operation of
- 21 the game is governed by this Act and by any rules adopted by
- the Department. The Department must consult with the Quality of
- 23 Life Board, which is established under Section 2310-348 of the
- 24 Department of Public Health Powers and Duties Law of the Civil
- 25 Administrative Code of Illinois, regarding the design and

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promotion of the game. If any provision of this Section is inconsistent with any other provision of this Act, then this Section governs.

(b) The Quality of Life Endowment Fund is created as a special fund in the State treasury. The net revenue from the Quality of Life special instant scratch-off game must be deposited into the Fund for appropriation by the General Assembly solely to the Department of Public Health for the purpose of HIV/AIDS-prevention education and for making grants to public or private entities in Illinois for the purpose of funding organizations that serve the highest at-risk categories for contracting HIV or developing AIDS. The recipient organizations must be engaged in HIV/AIDS-prevention education and HIV/AIDS healthcare treatment. The Department must, before grants are awarded, provide copies of all grant applications to the Quality of Life Board, receive and review the Board's recommendations and comments, and consult with the Board regarding the grants. For purposes of this Section, the term "research" includes, without limitation, expenditures to develop and advance the understanding, techniques, and modalities effective in the detection, prevention, screening, and treatment of HIV or AIDS among those in the highest risk categories for contracting or developing the diseases. The grant funds may not be used for institutional, organizational, or community-based overhead costs, indirect costs, or levies.

Moneys received for the purposes of this Section,

- 1 including, without limitation, net revenue from the special
- 2 instant scratch-off game and gifts, grants, and awards from any
- 3 public or private entity, must be deposited into the Fund. Any
- 4 interest earned on moneys in the Fund must be deposited into
- 5 the Fund.
- For purposes of this subsection, "net revenue" means the
- 7 total amount for which tickets have been sold less the sum of
- 8 the amount paid out in prizes and the actual administrative
- 9 expenses of the Department solely related to the Quality of
- 10 Life game.
- 11 (c) During the time that tickets are sold for the Quality
- of Life game, the Department shall not unreasonably diminish
- 13 the efforts devoted to marketing any other instant scratch-off
- 14 lottery game.
- 15 (d) The Department may adopt any rules necessary to
- implement and administer the provisions of this Section in
- 17 consultation with the Quality of Life Board.
- 18 Section 10. The Department of Public Health Powers and
- 19 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
- amended by adding Section 2310-348 as follows:
- 21 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-348 new)
- Sec. 2310-348. The Quality of Life Board.
- 23 (a) The Quality of Life Board is created as an advisory
- 24 board within the Department. The Board shall consist of 11

members as follows: 2 members appointed by the President of the
Senate; one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
Senate; 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
Representatives; one members appointed by the Minority Leader
of the House of Representatives; 2 members appointed by the
Governor, one of whom shall be designated as chair of the Board
at the time of appointment; and 3 members appointed by the
Director who represent organizations that advocate for the
healthcare needs of the first and second highest HIV/AIDS risk
groups, one each from the northern Illinois region, the central
Illinois region, and the southern Illinois region.

The Board members shall serve one 2-year term. If a vacancy occurs in the Board membership, the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment.

(b) Board members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their reasonable travel expenses from funds appropriated for that purpose. The Department shall provide staff and administrative support services to the Board.

(c) The Board must:

- (i) consult with the Department of Revenue in designing and promoting the Quality of Life special instant scratch-off lottery game; and
- (ii) review grant applications, make recommendations and comments, and consult with the Department of Public Health in making grants, from amounts appropriated from the Quality of Life Endowment Fund, to public or private

- 8 Section 15. The State Finance Act is amended by changing 9 Section 8h and by adding Section 5.675 as follows:
- 10 (30 ILCS 105/5.675 new)
- Sec. 5.675. The Quality of Life Endowment Fund.
- 12 (30 ILCS 105/8h)
- 13 Sec. 8h. Transfers to General Revenue Fund.
- 14 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section and 15 Section 8n of this Act, and (c), (d), or (e), notwithstanding 16 any other State law to the contrary, the Governor may, through June 30, 2007, from time to time direct the State Treasurer and 17 18 Comptroller to transfer a specified sum from any fund held by 19 the State Treasurer to the General Revenue Fund in order to 20 help defray the State's operating costs for the fiscal year. The total transfer under this Section from any fund in any 21 22 fiscal year shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 8% of the 23 revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year

or (ii) an amount that leaves a remaining fund balance of 25% 1 2 of the July 1 fund balance of that fiscal year. In fiscal year 2005 only, prior to calculating the July 1, 2004 final 3 balances, the Governor may calculate and direct the State 5 Treasurer with the Comptroller to transfer additional amounts determined by applying the formula authorized in Public Act 6 7 93-839 to the funds balances on July 1, 2003. No transfer may be made from a fund under this Section that would have the 8 9 effect of reducing the available balance in the fund to an 10 amount less than the amount remaining unexpended and unreserved 11 from the total appropriation from that fund estimated to be 12 expended for that fiscal year. This Section does not apply to any funds that are restricted by federal law to a specific use, 13 14 to any funds in the Motor Fuel Tax Fund, the Intercity 15 Passenger Rail Fund, the Hospital Provider Fund, the Medicaid 16 Provider Relief Fund, the Teacher Health Insurance Security 17 Fund, the Reviewing Court Alternative Dispute Resolution Fund, the Voters' Guide Fund, the Foreign Language Interpreter Fund, 18 19 the Lawyers' Assistance Program Fund, the Supreme Court Federal 20 Projects Fund, the Supreme Court Special State Projects Fund, 21 the Supplemental Low-Income Energy Assistance Fund, the Good 22 Samaritan Energy Trust Fund, the Low-Level Radioactive Waste 23 Facility Development and Operation Fund, the Horse Racing 24 Equity Trust Fund, or the Hospital Basic Services Preservation 25 Fund, or to any funds to which subsection (f) of Section 20-40 26 of the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act applies. 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transfers may be made under this Section from the 1 2 Population Control Fund. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, for fiscal year 2004, the total transfer under 3 this Section from the Road Fund or the State Construction 5 Account Fund shall not exceed the lesser of (i) 5% of the revenues to be deposited into the fund during that fiscal year 6 or (ii) 25% of the beginning balance in the fund. For fiscal 7 year 2005 through fiscal year 2007, no amounts may be 8 9 transferred under this Section from the Road Fund, the State Construction Account Fund, the Criminal Justice Information 10 11 Systems Trust Fund, the Wireless Service Emergency Fund, or the 12 Mandatory Arbitration Fund.

In determining the available balance in a fund, the Governor may include receipts, transfers into the fund, and other resources anticipated to be available in the fund in that fiscal year.

The State Treasurer and Comptroller shall transfer the amounts designated under this Section as soon as may be practicable after receiving the direction to transfer from the Governor.

- (a-5) Transfers directed to be made under this Section on or before February 28, 2006 that are still pending on May 19, 2006 (the effective date of Public Act 94-774) this amendatory Act of the 94th General Assembly shall be redirected as provided in Section 8n of this Act.
- (b) This Section does not apply to: (i) the Ticket For The

- 1 Cure Fund; (ii) any fund established under the Community Senior
- 2 Services and Resources Act; or (iii) on or after January 1,
- 3 2006 (the effective date of Public Act 94-511), the Child Labor
- 4 and Day and Temporary Labor Enforcement Fund.
- 5 (c) This Section does not apply to the Demutualization
- 6 Trust Fund established under the Uniform Disposition of
- 7 Unclaimed Property Act.
- 8 (d) This Section does not apply to moneys set aside in the

- Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon

becoming law. 1
