(a) Beginning July 1, 2007, an unmarried teacher may 8 9 designate a domestic partner by filing a written designation 10 with the System in the manner prescribed by the System. The System may require reasonable evidence that the person 11 12 designated meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (c). Such a designation is revocable at any time, but may not 13 14 be made or changed more than once in any 24-month period. The marriage of a teacher automatically revokes any designation of 15 16 a domestic partner previously made by that teacher.

17 (b) The designated domestic partner of a teacher shall be 18 eligible to receive survivor and death benefits under this 19 Article in the same manner and subject to the same conditions 20 as a surviving spouse. be deemed the equivalent of termination of the marriage.

(c) "Domestic partner" means an individual of the same 5 gender as an unmarried teacher who (1) is involved with the 6 7 teacher in a long-term relationship of indefinite duration; (2) 8 has resided together with the teacher at the same address for 9 at least 12 months; (3) is not related to the teacher by blood 10 to a degree of closeness that would prohibit legal marriage in 11 the state in which they legally reside; (4) is not married to 12 any other person; and (5) has an exclusive mutual commitment to 13 the teacher in which they agree to be jointly responsible for 14 each other's common welfare and to share financial obligations.

16 Sec. 17-121.1. Domestic partner eligibility. (a) Beginning July 1, 2007, an unmarried teacher may 17 18 designate a domestic partner by filing a written designation with the Fund in the manner prescribed by the Fund. The Fund 19 20 may require reasonable evidence that the person designated 21 meets the qualifications set forth in subsection (c). Such a 22 designation is revocable at any time, but may not be made or 23 changed more than once in any 24-month period. The marriage of 24 a teacher automatically revokes any designation of a domestic 25 partner previously made by that teacher.
