9	(a) The Task Force on Pharmace	euticals and Personal Care
10	Products and Other Emerging Conta	minants in Drinking Water
11	(Task Force) is established for	the purpose of a larger
12	understanding of the environmental	consequences of the use of
13	these products that are being found	in drinking water.
14	(b) The Task Force shall consi	st of the Director of the
15	Illinois Environmental Protection Ad	gency (Agency) or his or her
16	designee and 7 members appointed l	by the Director. Appointed

members must possess knowledge and expertise in the fields
relevant to testing community water supplies, both surface and
groundwater systems, including but not limited to analytical
chemistry, pharmacology/toxicology, risk assessment, and
hydrology. The Task Force shall initially focus on evaluating
pharmaceuticals and personal care products and other "emerging
contaminants", as the Task Force deems appropriate. The members
of the Task Force may organize themselves as they deem
necessary and shall serve without compensation. The Task Force
shall evaluate the environmental consequences considering the
following, conducted by the U.S. Environmental Protection
Agency, pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water and Clean Water
Acts and United States Geological Survey (USGS):
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- (1) Research data analyzing the effect of emerging contaminants on aquatic wildlife, including fish, and any evidence linking that research data to human health problems.
- (2) The accuracy of current technology (analytical procedures) for testing trace amounts of emerging contaminants (both individual and mixtures of chemicals), including the estimated costs of that testing and laboratories qualified to do that testing.
- (3) Standards and guidance, from federal or other international sources for the testing of both individual and mixtures of chemicals, and analytical procedures established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

1	for testing trace amounts of emerging contaminants.
2	(4) USGS National Reconnaissance of Pharmaceuticals,
3	Hormones and Other Organic Wastewater Contaminants in U.S.
4	Streams to determine environmental consequences.
5	(c) No later than December 31, 2009, the Task Force shall
6	submit its findings, along with recommendations for
7	legislation, to the General Assembly. The Agency shall also
8	post the findings of the Task Force evaluation on its web site.
9	(d) Repealer. This Section is repealed on July 1, 2011.
10	Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
11	becoming law.".
